1 construction to reduce the risk of injury to an occupant of the 2 vehicle in case of the vehicle's rollover; or

3 (3) is in the process of being loaded into or unloaded 4 from a trailer or another vehicle used to transport the motor 5 vehicle.

6 SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act to Section 29.011, Parks and Wildlife Code, applies to an offense committed on 7 8 or after the effective date of this Act. An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in 9 effect when the offense was committed, and the former law is 10 continued in effect for that purpose. For purposes of this section, 11 an offense was committed before the effective date of this Act if 12 any element of the offense was committed before that date. 13

14 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
