- 2 relating to the authority of a political subdivision to suspend 3 statutory deadlines during a disaster.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 418, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 418.1075 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 418.1075. SUSPENSION OF STATUTORY DEADLINES. (a)
- 8 Notwithstanding any other law, a statutory deadline imposed on a
- 9 political subdivision, including a deadline relating to a budget or
- 10 ad valorem tax, is suspended if:

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- 11 (1) the territory of the political subdivision is
- 12 wholly or partly located in the area of a disaster declared by the
- 13 president of the United States or the governor; and
- 14 (2) the presiding officer of the political subdivision
- or, if there is no presiding officer, the political subdivision's
- 16 governing body, proclaims the political subdivision is unable to
- 17 comply with the requirement because of the disaster.
- 18 (b) The presiding officer of the political subdivision or,
- 19 if there is no presiding officer, the political subdivision's
- 20 governing body, may issue an order ending the suspension of a
- 21 statutory deadline under this section. A statutory deadline may not
- 22 be suspended for more than 30 days after the date the presiding
- 23 officer or governing body, as appropriate, makes the proclamation
- 24 described by Subsection (a)(2).

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- 1 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 2 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 3 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 4 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 5 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
