SUSPENSION OF <u>CERTAIN</u> [PROCEDURAL] LAWS AND RULES. (a) The governor may suspend the provisions of any 1-17 regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state 1-18 business or the orders or rules of a state agency if strict compliance with the provisions, orders, or rules would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with a 1-19 1-20 1-21 1-22 disaster. (b) On request of a political subdivision, the governor may waive or suspend a deadline imposed by a statute or the orders or rules of a state agency on the political subdivision, including a 1-23 1**-**24 1**-**25 1-26 deadline relating to a budget or ad valorem tax, if the waiver or suspension is reasonably necessary to cope with a disaster. SECTION 2. Subchapter E, Chapter 418, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 418.1075 to read as follows: Sec. 418.1075. SUSPENSION OF DEADLINES IMPOSED BY LOCAL LAW. SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 1-48 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
