- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 37.212, Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 Section 37.212. INTERAGENCY COOPERATION. The center
- 7 shall:
- 8 <u>(1)</u> promote cooperation between state agencies,
- 9 institutions of higher education, and any local juvenile
- 10 delinquency prevention councils to address discipline and safety
- 11 issues in the state; and
- 12 (2) establish and develop criteria and minimum
- 13 guidelines required for school districts to enter into memorandum
- 14 of understanding and mutual aid agreements with local and regional
- 15 authorities, including first responders.
- SECTION 2. Section 7.009(a), Education Code is amended to
- 17 read as follows:
- 18 (a) In coordination with the Legislative Budget Board, the
- 19 agency shall establish an online clearinghouse of information
- 20 relating to best practices of campuses and school districts
- 21 regarding instruction, dropout prevention, public school finance,
- 22 resource allocation, safety, transportation, and business
- 23 practices. To the extent practicable, the agency shall ensure that
- 24 information provided through the online clearinghouse is specific,

- 2 high-performing and highly efficient campuses and school districts
- 3 rather than general guidelines relating to campus and school
- 4 district operation. The information must be accessible by
- 5 campuses, school districts, and interested members of the public.
- 6 SECTION 3. Section 34.012, Education Code: is amended to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 Section 34.012. THREE-POINT SEAT BELT INSTRUCTION;
- 9 INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE. (a) In coordination with the
- 10 Clearinghouse established under Section 7.009, Education Code, the
- 11 State Board of Education shall develop and make available to each
- 12 school district a program of instruction in the proper use of a
- 13 three-point seat belt.
- 14 (b) The Clearinghouse [State Board of Education] shall
- 15 serve as a clearinghouse of best practices for school districts
- 16 seeking the most efficient and sensible information regarding
- 17 school bus safety, including possible compliance with Section
- 18 547.701, Transportation Code, using school buses originally
- 19 purchased without seat belts.
- SECTION 4. Section 37.202, Education Code is amended to
- 21 read as follows:
- 22 Section 37.202. PURPOSE. The purpose of the center is to
- 23 serve as:
- 24 (1) a central location for school safety information,
- 25 including research, training, and technical assistance related to
- 26 successful school safety programs; [and]
- 27 (2) a resource for the prevention of youth violence

- 1 and the promotion of safety in the state; and
- 2 (3) provide school safety recommendations to the Texas
- 3 Education Agency and State Board of Education.
- 4 SECTION 5. Section 547.701, Transportation Code, is amended
- 5 to read as follows:
- 6 Section 537.701. ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS FOR
- 7 SCHOOL BUSES. (a) A school bus shall be equipped with:
- 8 (1) a convex mirror or other device that reflects to
- 9 the school bus operator a clear view of the area immediately in
- 10 front of the vehicle that would otherwise be hidden from view; [and]
- 11 (2) signal lamps that:
- 12 (A) are mounted as high and as widely spaced
- 13 laterally as practicable;
- 14 (B) display four alternately flashing red
- 15 lights, two located on the front at the same level and two located
- 16 on the rear at the same level; and
- 17 (C) emit a light visible at a distance of 500 feet
- 18 in normal sunlight; and
- 19 <u>(3) movable stop arms:</u>
- 20 (A) that conform to regulations adopted under
- 21 Section 34.002, Education Code; and
- (B) that may be operated only when the bus is
- 23 stopped to load or unload students.
- 24 (b) A school bus may be equipped with:
- 25 (1) rooftop warning lamps:
- 26 (A) that conform to and are placed on the bus in
- 27 accordance with specifications adopted under Section 34.002,

- 1 Education Code; and
- 2 (B) that are operated under rules adopted by the
- 3 school district; and
- 4 (2) a safety device recommended by the Texas School
- 5 Safety Center[movable stop arms:
- 6 [(A) that conform to regulations adopted under
- 7 Section 34.002, Education Code; and
- 8 [(B) that may be operated only when the bus is
- 9 stopped to load or unload students].
- 10 (c) When a school bus is being stopped or is stopped on a
- 11 highway to permit students to board or exit the bus, the operator of
- 12 the bus shall activate all flashing warning signal lights and other
- 13 equipment on the bus designed to warn other drivers that the bus is
- 14 stopping to load or unload children. A person may not operate such a
- 15 light or other equipment except when the bus is being stopped or is
- 16 stopped on a highway to permit students to board or exit the bus.
- 17 (d) The exterior of a school bus may not bear advertising or
- 18 another paid announcement directed at the public if the advertising
- 19 or announcement distracts from the effectiveness of required safety
- 20 warning equipment. The department shall adopt rules to implement
- 21 this subsection. A school bus that violates this section or rules
- 22 adopted under this section shall be placed out of service until it
- 23 complies.
- 24 SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect
- 25 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members
- 26 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas
- 27 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for

1 immediate effect, the Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
