4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 554.002, Government Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to read as
7	follows:
8	(a) A state or local governmental entity may not suspend or
9	terminate the employment of, or take other adverse personnel action
10	against, a public employee who in good faith reports a violation of
11	law by the employing governmental entity or another public
12	employee <u>:</u>
13	(1) to an appropriate law enforcement authority; or
14	(2) in the case of a public employee employed by a
15	school district, to either an appropriate law enforcement authority
16	or to a person specified by Subsection (c) concerning a violation of
17	law or rule described by that subsection.
18	(c) Subsection (a) applies to a school district employee who
19	in good faith:
20	(1) reports to an appropriate law enforcement
21	authority a violation of law by the district or another public
22	employee; or
23	(2) reports to the Texas Education Agency a violation
24	by the district or another public employee or reports to the

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1 <u>district a violation by another public employee of:</u>
2 <u>(A) the Education Code;</u>
3 <u>(B) a civil or penal law, if the violation</u>
4 <u>affects the safety of the educational environment; or</u>
5 <u>(C) a rule adopted by the commissioner of</u>
6 <u>education, the State Board of Education, or the State Board for</u>
7 Educator Certification.

SECTION 2. Section 554.002, Education Code, as amended by 8 this Act, applies only to a personnel action taken on or after the 9 10 effective date of this Act against a school district employee who reports a violation of law by a school district or another public 11 employee, regardless of the date on which the alleged violation of 12 law occurred or was reported. A personnel action taken before the 13 14 effective date of this Act against a school district employee who 15 reports a violation of law by a school district or another public employee is governed by the law in effect when the personnel action 16 17 was taken, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

18 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
