H.B. No. 3905

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the hiring of applicants for a beginning position in the 3 fire department or police department in certain municipalities. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 SECTION 1. Sections 143.025(a), (b), (c), (h), and (j), 5 Local Government Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) The commission shall provide for open, competitive, and free entrance examinations to add applicants to the applicable 8 9 [provide] eligibility list [lists] for a beginning position [positions] in the fire or [and] police department [departments]. 10 11 The examinations are open to each person who makes a proper 12 application and meets the requirements prescribed by this chapter. The [An] eligibility list for a beginning position in 13 (b) 14 the fire or police department may be created only as a result of a competitive examination [held in the presence of each applicant for 15 16 the position, except as provided by Subsections (d) and (e)]. The examination must be based on the person's general knowledge and 17 aptitude and must inquire into the applicant's general education 18 and mental ability. A person may not be appointed to the fire or 19 police department except as a result of the examination. 20

21 (c) <u>The commission shall adopt rules to standardize the</u> 22 <u>procedures for entrance examinations. The rules must provide:</u> 23 <u>(1) procedures for administering the exam:</u> 24 <u>(1) is the last to standardize the</u>

24 (A) in the department; or

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1 (B) at a professional testing site in this state 2 or in another state; and 3 (2) security protocols to prevent an unfair advantage to any applicant. [An applicant may not take an examination unless 4 5 at least one other applicant taking the examination is present.] (h) The commission shall keep each applicant who passes the 6 examination on the eligibility list for a beginning position in the 7 fire department or on the eligibility list for a beginning position 8 in the police department, as applicable, [in effect] for a period of 9 not less than six months or more than 12 months, unless the 10 applicant is appointed to a beginning position in [names of all 11 applicants on the list have been referred to] the appropriate 12 The commission shall determine the length of the 13 department. 14 period. The commission shall give new examinations at times the 15 commission considers necessary to provide required staffing for scheduled fire or police training academies. 16

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17 (j) Notwithstanding Subsection (i), each applicant who is either a natural-born or adopted child of a fire fighter who 18 previously suffered a line-of-duty death while covered by this 19 chapter shall be ranked at the top of the [any] eligibility list if 20 the [in which said] applicant receives a minimum passing grade on 21 [that respective] eligibility exam. The deceased fire 22 the 23 fighter's applicant child must otherwise satisfy all of the 24 requirements for eligibility for a beginning position in a fire department contained in this chapter. The [This] commission shall 25 promulgate rules to identify and verify each applicant's 26 eligibility for applicability of this subsection. 27

SECTION 2. Section 143.026, Local Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

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3 Sec. 143.026. PROCEDURE FOR FILLING BEGINNING POSITIONS. 4 (a) When a vacancy occurs in a beginning position in a fire or 5 police department, [the department head shall request in writing 6 from the commission the names of suitable persons from the 7 eligibility list. The director shall certify to the municipality's 8 chief executive the names of the three persons having the highest 9 grades on the eligibility list.

10 [(b) From the three names certified,] the <u>municipality's</u> 11 chief executive shall appoint the person having the highest grade 12 <u>on the entrance examination</u> unless there is a valid reason <u>not to</u> 13 [why the person having the second or third highest grade should be 14 <u>appointed</u>].

15 (b) [(c)] If the chief executive does not appoint the person 16 having the highest grade, the chief executive shall clearly set 17 forth in writing the good and sufficient reason why the person <u>or</u> 18 <u>persons</u> having <u>a higher</u> [the highest] grade <u>than the person</u> 19 <u>appointed were</u> [was] not appointed.

20 (c) [(d)] The reason required by Subsection (b) [(c)] shall
21 be filed with the commission and a copy provided to any [the] person
22 having a higher [the highest] grade than the person appointed. [If
23 the chief executive appoints the person having the third highest
24 grade, a copy of the report shall also be furnished to the person
25 having the second highest grade.]

26 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 143.083, Local Government 27 Code, is amended to read as follows:

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Sec. 143.083. EMERGENCY APPOINTMENT OF TEMPORARY FIRE
 FIGHTERS [AND POLICE OFFICERS].

3 SECTION 4. Section 143.083(a), Local Government Code, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 (a) If a municipality is unable to recruit qualified fire 6 fighters [or police officers] because of the maximum age limit 7 prescribed by Section 143.023 and the municipality's governing body 8 finds that this inability creates an emergency, the commission 9 shall recommend to the governing body additional rules governing 10 the temporary employment of persons who are 36 years of age or 11 older.

 SECTION 5. Sections
 143.023(c),
 143.024(b),
 and

 13
 143.025(d), (e), and (g), Local Government Code, are repealed.

14 SECTION 6. (a) The changes in law made by this Act to 15 Section 143.025, Local Government Code, apply to an entrance examination administered on or after the effective date of this 16 An entrance examination administered before the effective 17 Act. date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date that 18 19 examination was administered with respect to the procedures for taking the examination, and the former law is continued in effect 20 for that purpose. However, the changes in law made by this Act 21 regarding the creation of a continuous eligibility list for a 22 beginning position in a fire or police department apply on the 23 24 effective date of this Act in relation to an examination given before, on, or after the effective date of this Act. 25

(b) The change in law made by this Act to Section 143.026,
27 Local Government Code, applies only to an appointment made on or

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1 after the effective date of this Act. An appointment made before 2 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on 3 the date the appointment was made, and the former law is continued 4 in effect for that purpose.

5 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
