## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to certain voting requirements and procedures.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. In enacting this legislation, the legislature
- 5 intends to express a broad consensus of the members and presiding
- 6 officers toward ensuring and enhancing two equally important and
- 7 compatible tenets of our democracy:
- 8 (1) the inviolability of the basic right of each voter
- 9 to be able to cast a ballot in any election in which the voter is
- 10 eligible to vote; and
- 11 (2) the integrity of the electoral process, to the end
- 12 that each vote cast by an eligible voter in an election be counted
- 13 and given equal weight without dilution by votes cast by persons not
- 14 eligible to vote in the election.
- 15 SECTION 2. (a) On offering to vote in an election, a voter
- 16 must present to an election officer at the polling place the voter's
- 17 voter registration certificate and one or more forms of
- 18 identification, including photo or nonphoto identification, to
- 19 help ensure a reliable and efficient voting process that protects
- 20 against and discourages voting fraud and other forms of unlawful
- 21 voting, prevents the votes of ineligible voters from being counted,
- 22 and facilitates and allows the votes of eligible voters to be
- 23 counted. To these ends, voter affidavits and other alternative
- 24 voting procedures shall be executed and followed if necessary to

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- 1 implement appropriate exceptions or modifications to the identification requirements to further balance the goals of 2 3 facilitating eligible voter participation and preventing voting fraud and other forms of unlawful voting. Provisional voting shall 4 be required, as appropriate and necessary, for certain voters to 5 vote when the applicable identification requirements and related 6 voting requirements are not met. The secretary of state shall 7 8 prescribe appropriate procedures as necessary to implement this subsection. 9
- 10 (b) To facilitate the balancing of the goals, as described by Subsection (a) of this section, of ensuring a reliable and 11 12 efficient voting process that protects against and discourages voting fraud and other forms of unlawful voting, preventing the 13 14 votes of ineligible voters from being counted, and facilitating and 15 allowing the votes of eligible voters to be counted, related voting procedures and processes shall be added or modified as appropriate. 16 17 Notification of the identification requirements and procedures described by Subsection (a) of this section shall be 18 19 provided to voters on appropriate documents during the voter registration process, on the websites of the secretary of state and 20 voter registrars who maintain websites, and on a posting outside 21 each polling location. The identification requirements and related 22 23 procedures shall be included in the training standards for election 24 officers and in the training programs provided by local election The secretary of state shall prescribe appropriate 25 officials. 26 procedures as necessary to implement this subsection.
  - (c) The Department of Public Safety may not collect a fee

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- 1 for a personal identification certificate if the person is a voter
- 2 or applicant for voter registration and is obtaining the
- 3 certificate for the purpose of satisfying the identification
- 4 requirements described by Subsection (a) of this section.
- 5 SECTION 3. To the extent of any conflict with the Election
- 6 Code or other law, this Act prevails.
- 7 SECTION 4. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (b) of this
- 8 section, this Act takes effect January 1, 2010.
- 9 (b) The changes in law made by Section 2(b) of this Act
- 10 regarding training standards, training programs, and notification
- 11 requirements on websites and during the voter registration process
- 12 take effect September 1, 2009.
