A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to reduced tuition rates at public institutions of higher
- 3 education for certain children of state employees.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 54, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 54.0615 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 54.0615. REDUCED TUITION RATES FOR CERTAIN CHILDREN OF
- 8 STATE EMPLOYEES. (a) This section applies to tuition charged in a
- 9 semester or other academic term to a resident student of an
- 10 institution of higher education:
- 11 (1) who is 23 years of age or younger; and
- 12 (2) whose parent is employed full-time by this state
- or an agency of this state and has been so employed for at least six
- 14 months before the semester or other term begins.
- 15 (b) An institution of higher education shall charge a
- 16 student to whom this section applies a total amount of tuition,
- 17 including designated tuition under Section 54.0513, that is at
- 18 <u>least 10 percent less than the amount that would otherwise be</u>
- 19 charged to the student.
- 20 <u>(c) The Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board shall</u>
- 21 adopt rules for the administration of this section.
- 22 SECTION 2. Section 54.0615, Education Code, as added by
- 23 this Act, applies beginning with tuition charged by an institution
- 24 of higher education for the 2009 fall semester. If a person who

- 1 becomes eligible for a reduced tuition rate in that semester under
- 2 that section has paid the tuition for that semester, the
- 3 institution of higher education shall refund to the student the
- 4 excess amount of the tuition paid. Tuition for a term or semester
- 5 before the 2009 fall semester is covered by the law in effect
- 6 immediately before the effective date of this Act, and the former
- 7 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 8 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 9 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 10 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 11 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 12 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
