- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 39.903(e), Utilities Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (e) Money in the system benefit fund may be appropriated to
- 8 provide funding solely for the following regulatory purposes, in
- 9 the following order of priority:
- 10 (1) programs to:
- 11 (A) assist low-income electric customers by
- 12 providing the 10 percent reduced rate prescribed by Subsection (h);
- 13 and
- 14 (B) provide one-time bill payment assistance to
- 15 electric customers who are or who have in their households one or
- 16 more seriously ill or disabled low-income persons and who have been
- 17 threatened with disconnection for nonpayment;
- 18 (2) customer education programs, administrative
- 19 expenses incurred by the commission in implementing and
- 20 administering this chapter, and expenses incurred by the office
- 21 under this chapter;
- 22 (3) programs to assist low-income electric customers
- 23 by providing the targeted energy efficiency programs described by
- 24 Subsection (f)(2), including programs to provide low-income

1 <u>electric customers with advanced meters</u>;

- 2 (4) programs to assist low-income electric customers
- 3 by providing the 20 percent reduced rate prescribed by Subsection
- 4 (h); and
- 5 (5) reimbursement to the commission and the Health and
- 6 Human Services Commission for expenses incurred in the
- 7 implementation and administration of an integrated eligibility
- 8 process created under Section 17.007 for customer service discounts
- 9 relating to retail electric service, including outreach expenses
- 10 the commission determines are reasonable and necessary.
- 11 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
