A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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- 2 relating to reducing the written information that public school
- 3 educators can be required to provide.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 7.060(b), Education Code, is amended to
- 6 read as follows:
- 7 (b) The commissioner shall adopt a policy that limits
- 8 written reports and other paperwork that a principal or classroom
- 9 teacher may be required by the agency to complete. The policy must
- 10 include a provision that any rule adopted by the commissioner must
- 11 state whether the rule requires a principal or classroom teacher to
- 12 complete a written report or other paperwork.
- SECTION 2. Section 11.164, Education Code, is amended by
- 14 amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (a-1) to read as
- 15 follows:
- 16 (a) The board of trustees of each school district shall
- 17 limit redundant requests for information and the number and length
- 18 of written reports that a classroom teacher is required to prepare.
- 19 A classroom teacher may not be required to prepare any written
- 20 information other than:
- 21 (1) any report concerning the health, safety, or
- 22 welfare of a student;
- 23 (2) a report of a student's grade on an assignment or
- 24 examination;

- 1 (3) a report of a student's academic progress in a
- 2 class or course to the extent required in carrying out Section
- 3 28.022;
- 4 (4) a report of a student's grades at the end of each
- 5 grade reporting period;
- 6 (5) a textbook report;
- 7 (6) a unit or weekly lesson plan that outlines, in a
- 8 brief and general manner, the information to be presented during
- 9 each period at the secondary level or in each subject or topic at
- 10 the elementary level;
- 11 (7) an attendance report;
- 12 (8) any report required for accreditation review;
- 13 (9) any information required by a school district that
- 14 relates to a complaint, grievance, or actual or potential
- 15 litigation and that requires the classroom teacher's involvement;
- 16 or
- 17 (10) any information specifically required by law,
- 18 rule, or regulation.
- 19 <u>(a-1)</u> For purposes of this section, preparation of written
- 20 information includes the submission or compilation of information
- 21 using a computer program, Internet website, or other electronic
- 22 method.
- SECTION 3. Section 39.075(b-1), Education Code, is amended
- 24 to read as follows:
- 25 (b-1) The commissioner may authorize special accreditation
- 26 investigations to be conducted in response to repeated complaints
- 27 submitted to the agency concerning imposition of excessive

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- 1 paperwork requirements on classroom teachers. The commissioner
- 2 shall establish and publicize among classroom teachers and any
- 3 other appropriate persons a process by which complaints can be made
- 4 concerning imposition of excessive paperwork requirements on
- 5 classroom teachers.
- 6 SECTION 4. Not later than January 31, 2010, the
- 7 commissioner of education shall adopt a policy as required by
- 8 Section 7.060(b), Education Code, as amended by this Act. A
- 9 provision that is included in the policy to comply with Section
- 10 7.060(b), Education Code, as amended by this Act, applies only to a
- 11 rule adopted by the commissioner of education on or after the date
- 12 the provision takes effect.
- 13 SECTION 5. Not later than January 31, 2010, the
- 14 commissioner of education shall establish and publicize, as
- 15 required by Section 39.075(b-1), Education Code, as amended by this
- 16 Act, a process by which complaints can be made concerning
- 17 imposition of excessive paperwork requirements on classroom
- 18 teachers.
- 19 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 20 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 21 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 22 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 23 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
