6	SECURITY REQUIREMENTS
7	SECTION 1.01. The heading to Chapter 521, Transportation
8	Code, is amended to read as follows:
9	CHAPTER 521. DRIVER'S LICENSES AND <u>IDENTIFICATION CARDS</u>
10	[CERTIFICATES]
11	SECTION 1.02. Section 521.001(a), Transportation Code, is
12	amended by amending Subdivision (3) and adding Subdivisions (5-a)
13	and (10) to read as follows:
14	(3) "Driver's license" means an authorization issued
15	by the department for the operation of a motor vehicle. The term
16	includes:
17	(A) a <u>learner's license</u> [ <del>temporary license or</del>
18	<pre>instruction permit]; and</pre>
19	(B) an occupational license.
20	(5-a) "Identification card" means a document issued by
21	the department verifying a person's identity.
22	(10) "Temporary driver's license" or "temporary
23	identification card" means a driver's license or identification
24	card issued to a person who is not a citizen or legal permanent

H.B. No. 4036 resident of the United States but has been granted lawful temporary 1 status in the United States by the United States agency responsible 2 for citizenship and immigration. A temporary driver's license 3 includes a learner's license, provisional license, 4 and occupational license. 5 6 SECTION 1.03. Subchapter A, Chapter 521, Transportation 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 521.007 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 521.007. RESTRICTIONS ON ISSUANCE. The department may not issue both a driver's license and an identification card to the 9 10 same individual. SECTION 1.04. Sections 521.044(a) and (b), Transportation 11 12 Code, are amended to read as follows: Information provided on 13 (a) а driver's license or 14 identification card application that relates to the applicant's 15 social security number may be used only by the department or disclosed only to: 16 17 (1) the child support enforcement division of the attorney general's office; 18 19 (2) another state entity responsible for enforcing the payment of child support; [or] 20 (3) the United States Selective Service System as 21 provided by Section 521.147; or 22 (4) another state's driver's licensing agency or 23 24 central record system as required by federal law. 25 The department shall enter an applicant's social (b) 26 security number in the department's electronic database but may not print the number on the applicant's driver's license 27 or

1 identification card.

2 SECTION 1.05. Section 521.101, Transportation Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 Sec. 521.101. [PERSONAL] IDENTIFICATION <u>CARD</u> 5 [CERTIFICATE]. (a) The department shall issue [personal] 6 identification <u>cards</u> [certificates].

7 (b) <u>An</u> [A personal] identification <u>card</u> [certificate] must
8 be similar in form to, but distinguishable in color from, a driver's
9 license.

10 (c) The department shall indicate "UNDER 21" on the face of 11 <u>an</u> [a personal] identification <u>card</u> [certificate] issued to a 12 person under 21 years of age.

13 (d) The department may require each applicant for an 14 original, renewal, or duplicate [personal] identification <u>card</u> 15 [certificate] to furnish to the department the information required 16 by Section 521.142.

(e) The department may cancel and require surrender of <u>an</u> [<del>a</del> personal] identification <u>card</u> [certificate] after determining that the holder [was] <u>is</u> not entitled to the <u>identification card</u> [certificate] or gave incorrect or incomplete information in the application for the <u>identification card</u> [certificate].

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(f) <u>An identification card</u> [<u>A certificate</u>] expires:

23 (1) on a date specified by the department <u>if the</u>
 24 <u>applicant is a citizen or legal permanent resident of the United</u>
 25 <u>States; or</u>

26 (2) if the applicant is not a citizen or legal
27 permanent resident of the United States:

1 (A) the expiration of the applicant's authorized 2 stay in the United States; or 3 (B) one year from the issuance date if there is no definite expiration date for the authorized stay in the United 4 5 States. [, except that a certificate issued to a person 60 years of age or older does not expire]. 6 7 (f-1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States must 8 present to the department documentation issued by the United States agency responsible for citizenship and immigration authorizing the 9 10 person to be in the United States before the person may be issued an identification card. 11 An individual, corporation, or association may not deny 12 (q) the holder of <u>an</u> [a personal] identification <u>card</u> [certificate] 13 14 access to goods, services, or facilities, except as provided by Section 521.460 or in regard to the operation of a motor vehicle, 15 because the holder has an [a personal] identification card 16 17 [certificate] rather than a driver's license. (h) The department shall automatically 18 revoke each 19 [<del>personal</del>] identification card [certificate] issued by the department to a person who: 20 21 is subject to the registration requirements of (1)Chapter 62, Code of Criminal Procedure; and 22

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(2) fails to apply to the department for renewal of the
 [personal] identification <u>card</u> [certificate] as required by
 Article 62.060, Code of Criminal Procedure.

26 (i) The department may issue <u>an</u> [<del>a personal</del>] identification
 27 <u>card</u> [<del>certificate</del>] to a person whose <u>identification card</u>

1 [certificate] is revoked under Subsection (h) only if the person 2 applies for an original or renewal <u>identification card</u> 3 [certificate] under Section 521.103.

4 SECTION 1.06. Section 521.103, Transportation Code, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Sec. 521.103. EXPIRATION AND RENEWAL REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN SEX OFFENDERS. (a) The department may issue an original 7 8 or renewal [personal] identification card [certificate] to a person whose 9 driver's license or [personal] identification card [certificate] record indicates that the person is subject to the 10 registration requirements of Chapter 62, Code of Criminal 11 12 Procedure, only if the person:

(1) applies in person for the issuance of <u>an</u>
 <u>identification card</u> [<del>a certificate</del>] under this section; and

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(2) pays a fee of \$20.

16 (b) <u>An</u> [<u>A personal</u>] identification <u>card</u> [<del>certificate</del>] 17 issued under this section, including a renewal, duplicate, or 18 corrected <u>identification card</u> [<del>certificate</del>], expires:

6	SECTION 1.07. Section 521.104, Transportation Code, is

9	department by rule may provide that the holder of <u>an</u> [ <del>a personal</del> ]
10	identification <u>card</u> [ <del>certificate</del> ] may renew the <u>card</u> [ <del>certificate</del> ]
11	by mail, by telephone, over the Internet, or by other electronic
12	means. A rule adopted under this section may prescribe eligibility
13	standards for renewal under this section.
14	SECTION 1.08. Section 521.121(a), Transportation Code, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	(a) The driver's license must include:
17	(1) a distinguishing number assigned by the department
18	to the license holder;
19	(2) a <u>digital</u> [ <del>color</del> ] photograph of the entire face of
20	the holder;
21	(3) the full <u>legal</u> name, date of birth, <u>gender,</u> and
22	residence address of the holder; and
23	(4) a brief description of the holder.
24	SECTION 1.09. Section 521.124, Transportation Code, is
25	amended to read as follows:
26	Sec. 521.124. TEMPORARY LICENSE OR TEMPORARY
27	<u>IDENTIFICATION CARD</u> [ <del>; ISSUED WITHOUT PHOTOGRAPH</del> ]. (a) The

1 department <u>shall</u> [may] issue a temporary <u>driver's</u> license <u>or</u> 2 <u>temporary identification card</u> [without a photograph of the license 3 holder:

4 [(1)] to an applicant who is <u>not a citizen</u> or legal
5 permanent resident[<del>out of state or a member of the armed forces</del>] of
6 the United States <u>and has temporary lawful status in the United</u>
7 States[<del>; or</del>

8 [(2) if the department otherwise determines that a
9 temporary license is necessary].

10 (b) <u>A temporary driver's license or temporary</u> 11 identification card expires:

26(d) A temporary driver's license or temporary27identification card must be distinctively marked on the face of the

2 (e) A temporary driver's license or temporary
3 identification card cannot be issued for a term longer than maximum
4 term of a driver's license or identification card issued under this
5 chapter.

6 SECTION 1.10. Section 521.142, Transportation Code, is 7 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), (e), and (g) and 8 adding Subsection (i) to read as follows:

9 (a) An application for an original license must state the applicant's full <u>legal</u> name and place and date of birth. This 10 information must be verified by presentation of proof of identity 11 12 satisfactory to the department and in compliance with applicable federal law. A person who is not a citizen of the United States must 13 14 present to the department documentation issued by the United States 15 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration authorizing the person to be in the United States before the person may be issued a 16 17 driver's license or identification card. [<del>The department must</del> accept as satisfactory proof of identity under this subsection an 18 offender identification card or similar form of identification 19 issued to an inmate by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.] 20

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(b) The application must include:

(1) the thumbprints of the applicant or, if thumbprints cannot be taken, the index fingerprints of the applicant;

25	(2)	a <u>digital</u> photograph of the applicant;
26	(3)	the signature of the applicant; and
27	(4)	a brief description of the applicant.

No. 4036 1 (c) The application must state: 2 the gender [sex] of the applicant; (1)3 (2) the principal residence address of the applicant; 4 (3) whether the applicant has been licensed to drive a 5 motor vehicle or issued an identification card before; 6 (4) if previously licensed or issued an identification 7 card, when and by what state or country; 8 (5) whether that license or driving privilege has been suspended or revoked or a license application denied; 9 (6) the date 10 and reason for the suspension, revocation, or denial; 11 12 (7) whether the applicant is a citizen of the United States; and 13 the county of residence of the applicant. 14 (8) 15 (e) The application must include any other information the department requires to determine the applicant's identity, 16 17 residency, competency, and eligibility as required by the department or state or federal law. 18 19 (g) The department shall [may] require an applicant to provide the applicant's social security number or proof of 20 ineligibility for a social security number as required by state or 21 federal law [only for a purpose permitted by Section 521.044]. 22 23 (i) The application must be accompanied by a sworn statement 24 certifying that the information provided on the application is true 25 and correct. SECTION 1.11. Section 521.182, Transportation Code, 26 is amended to read as follows: 27

Sec. 521.182. SURRENDER OF LICENSE OR IDENTIFICATION CARD 1 2 ISSUED BY OTHER JURISDICTION. (a) A person is not entitled to receive a driver's license or identification card until the person 3 terminates by surrendering [surrenders] to the department each 4 5 driver's license or identification card in the person's possession that was issued by this state or another state or Canadian province. 6 7 (a-1) The department may invalidate the surrendered license 8 or identification card and return it to the applicant.

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9 (b) The department shall send to the state or province that 10 issued the license <u>or identification card</u>:

(1) the surrendered license <u>or identification card</u> or a notification that the license <u>or identification card</u> has been surrendered; and

6 521.161 other than the driving test.

7 (b) The department may issue <u>a learner's license</u> [<del>an</del> 8 instruction permit] to a person 18 years of age or older who has 9 successfully passed all parts of the driver's examination required 10 under Section 521.161 other than the driving test.

11 (c) A driver education school may issue <u>a learner's license</u>
12 [an instruction permit] to a person 18 years of age or older who has
13 successfully passed:

14 (1) a six-hour adult classroom driver education course15 approved by the Texas Education Agency; and

16 (2) each part of the driver's examination required by17 Section 521.161 other than the driving test.

18 (d) <u>A learner's license</u> [An instruction permit] entitles
19 the holder to operate a type of motor vehicle on a highway while:

20 (1) the <u>learner's license</u> [<del>permit</del>] is in the holder's
21 possession; and

(2) the holder is accompanied by a person occupyingthe seat by the operator who:

(A) holds a license that qualifies the operatorto operate that type of vehicle;

26 (B) is 21 years of age or older; and
27 (C) has at least one year of driving experience.

(e) [Except as provided by Subsection (f), an instruction
 permit is not required to include a photograph.

3 [(f)] The department may issue <u>a learner's license</u> [<del>an</del> 4 <u>instruction permit</u>] under this section to a person who is subject to 5 the registration requirements under Chapter 62, Code of Criminal 6 Procedure, and is otherwise eligible for the <u>learner's license</u> 7 [<del>permit</del>].

8 (f) A learner's license [An instruction permit issued under 9 this subsection] must include a photograph of the <u>license holder</u> 10 [<del>person</del>].

(g) A person who occupies the seat in a vehicle by a holder of <u>a learner's license</u> [an instruction permit] commits an offense if, while the holder is operating the vehicle, the person:

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(1) sleeps;

15 (2) is intoxicated, as defined by Section 49.01, Penal16 Code; or

17 (3) is engaged in an activity that prevents the person18 from observing and responding to the actions of the operator.

(h) It is a defense to prosecution [of a violation] under Subsection (g) that at the time of the violation another person in addition to the defendant:

17 (e) The department may issue a temporary nonresident commercial driver's license to a person who does not present a 18 social security card as required by Section 522.021(a-1)(1) but who 19 otherwise meets the requirements for a temporary [nonresident] 20 21 commercial driver's license, including the requirement that the 22 commercial motor vehicle testing and licensing standards of the country of which the applicant is a resident not meet the testing 23 24 and licensing standards established by 49 C.F.R. Part 383. A 25 license issued under this subsection:

SECTION 1.20. Sections 20 522.021(a), (c), and (d), Transportation Code, are amended to read as follows: 21 An application for a commercial driver's license or 22 (a) commercial driver learner's <u>license</u> [permit] must include: 23 24 (1) the full legal name and current principal residence and mailing address of the applicant; 25 26 (2) a physical description of the applicant, including 27 gender [sex], height, and eye color;

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(3) the applicant's date of birth;

2 (4) the applicant's social security number, unless the
3 application is for a <u>temporary</u> nonresident commercial driver's
4 license and the applicant is a resident of a foreign jurisdiction;

5 (5) certifications, including those required by 49 6 C.F.R. Section 383.71(a); and

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(6) any other information required by the department.

8 (c) The application must meet the requirements of an 9 application under <u>Sections</u> [Section] 521.141 <u>and 521.142</u> and must 10 be accompanied by the fee required under Section 522.029. The 11 department may require documentary evidence to verify the 12 information required by Subsection (a).

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## ARTICLE 4. TRANSITION; EFFECTIVE DATE

5 SECTION 4.01. (a) Subject to Subsection (b) of this section, the changes in law made by this Act apply to a driver's 6 license, commercial driver's license, commercial driver learner's 7 8 license, or identification card issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A driver's license, commercial driver's 9 personal 10 license, commercial driver learner's permit, or identification certificate issued or renewed before the effective 11 12 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the license, permit, or certificate was issued or renewed, and the former law is 13 14 continued in effect for that purpose.

(b) The Department of Public Safety, as authorized by Sections 521.271(c) and 522.051(g), Transportation Code, as added by this Act, may require the renewal of a driver's license, commercial driver's license, commercial driver learner's permit, or personal identification certificate issued or renewed before the effective date of this Act.
