A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the residency requirements for tuition and fee

- 3 exemptions for certain military personnel and their dependents.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 54.203, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a), (b), (b-1), and (d) and adding Subsection
- 7 (a-1) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 9 education shall exempt the following persons from the payment of
- 10 all dues, fees, and charges, including fees for correspondence
- 11 courses but excluding general deposit fees, student services fees,
- 12 and any fees or charges for lodging, board, or clothing, provided
- 13 the <u>persons</u> [<u>persons</u>] seeking the <u>exemption declared this state as</u>
- 14 the person's home of record in the manner provided by the applicable
- 15 military or other service [exemptions were citizens of Texas] at
- 16 the time the person [they] entered the service [services indicated]
- 17 and is a resident of this state under Subchapter B [have resided in
- 18 Texas for at least the period of 12 months before the date of
- 19 registration]:
- 20 (1) all nurses and honorably discharged members of the
- 21 armed forces of the United States who served during the
- 22 Spanish-American War or during World War I;
- 23 (2) all nurses, members of the Women's Army Auxiliary
- 24 Corps, members of the Women's Auxiliary Volunteer Emergency

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- 1 Service, and all honorably discharged members of the armed forces
- 2 of the United States who served during World War II except those who
- 3 were discharged from service because they were over the age of 38 or
- 4 because of a personal request on the part of the person that the
- 5 person [he] be discharged from service;
- 6 (3) all honorably discharged men and women of the
- 7 armed forces of the United States who served during the national
- 8 emergency which began on June 27, 1950, and which is referred to as
- 9 the Korean War; and
- 10 (4) all persons who were honorably discharged from the
- 11 armed forces of the United States after serving on active military
- 12 duty, excluding training, for more than 180 days and who served a
- 13 portion of their active duty during:
- 14 (A) the Cold War which began on the date of the
- 15 termination of the national emergency cited in Subdivision (3) [$\frac{\text{of}}{\text{of}}$
- 16 this subsection];
- 17 (B) the Vietnam era which began on December 21,
- 18 1961, and ended on May 7, 1975;
- 19 (C) the Grenada and Lebanon era which began on
- 20 August 24, 1982, and ended on July 31, 1984;
- (D) the Panama era which began on December 20,
- 22 1989, and ended on January 21, 1990;
- (E) the Persian Gulf War which began on August 2,
- 24 1990, and ends on the date thereafter prescribed by Presidential
- 25 proclamation or September 1, 1997, whichever occurs first;
- 26 (F) the national emergency by reason of certain
- 27 terrorist attacks that began on September 11, 2001; or

- 1 (G) any future national emergency declared in
- 2 accordance with federal law.
- 3 (a-1) A person who received an exemption provided by
- 4 Subsection (a) in the 2008-2009 academic year continues to be
- 5 eligible for the exemption provided by that subsection as long as
- 6 the person is continuously enrolled in an institution of higher
- 7 education, subject to the other provisions of this section other
- 8 than the requirement of Subsection (a) that the person must have
- 9 declared this state as the person's home of record at the time of
- 10 entering the service.
- 11 (b) The exemptions provided for in Subsection (a) [of this
- 12 section] also apply [and inure] to [the benefit of]:
- 13 (1) the children of members of the armed forces of the
- 14 United States:
- 15 (A) who are or were killed in action;
- 16 (B) who die or died while in service;
- 17 (C) who are missing in action;
- 18 (D) whose death is documented to be directly
- 19 caused by illness or injury connected with service in the armed
- 20 forces of the United States; or
- 21 (E) who became totally disabled for purposes of
- 22 employability according to the disability ratings of the Department
- 23 of Veterans Affairs as a result of a service-related injury; and
- 24 (2) the [orphans or] children of members of the Texas
- 25 National Guard and the Texas Air National Guard who:
- 26 (A) were killed since January 1, 1946, while on
- 27 active duty either in the service of their state or the United

- 1 States; or
- 2 (B) are totally disabled for purposes of
- 3 employability according to the disability ratings of the Department
- 4 of Veterans Affairs, regardless of whether the members are eligible
- 5 to receive disability benefits from the department, as a result of a
- 6 service-related injury suffered since January 1, 1946, while on
- 7 active duty either in the service of this state or the United
- 8 States.
- 9 (b-1) To qualify for an exemption under Subsection (b), a
- 10 person must [be a citizen of Texas and must] have resided in this
- 11 [the] state for at least 12 months immediately preceding the date of
- 12 the person's registration.
- 13 (d) The governing board of each institution of higher
- 14 education granting an exemption under this section [exemptions]
- 15 shall require every applicant claiming the [benefit of an]
- 16 exemption to submit satisfactory evidence that the applicant
- 17 qualifies for [he fulfills] the exemption [necessary citizenship
- 18 and residency requirements].
- 19 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies
- 20 beginning with tuition and fees for the 2009 fall semester. Tuition
- 21 and fees for a term or semester before the 2009 fall semester are
- 22 covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 23 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 24 purpose.
- 25 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
