SECTION 2. (a) In appointing the initial appointed members the Border Region, as added by this Act:

(1) the lieutenant governor shall appoint one member to serve a term expiring February 1, 2010;
(2) the speaker of the house of representatives shall

appoint one member to serve a term expiring February 1, 2010; and

(3) the administration of the institution of higher education that administers the bureau shall appoint one member to serve a term expiring February 1, 2010, and two members to serve a term expiring February 1, 2011.

(b) As soon as practicable after the initial appointed members of the steering committee of the Bureau for Economic Development of the Border Region have been appointed in accordance with Sections 471.002(b)(1) and (2), Government Code, as added by this Act, and have qualified for office, the initial members of the steering committee that have been appointed under Sections 471.002(b)(1) and (2), Government Code, as added by this Act, and the initial members designated under Section 471.002(b)(4), Government Code, as added by this Act, shall designate the institution of higher education as required by Section 471.002, Government Code, as added by this Act.

SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
