## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to an intensive reading improvement program for public
3	school students of limited English proficiency.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 29.069 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 29.069. INTENSIVE READING IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM. (a)
8	school district shall provide to students of limited English
9	proficiency, in accordance with this section, a reading improvement
10	<pre>program that:</pre>
11	(1) is designed to:
12	(A) prevent students from having long-term
13	reading difficulties; and
14	(B) reduce the risk of students dropping out of
15	school;
16	(2) provides individualized, intensive, and
17	accelerated instruction; and
18	(3) is aligned with the required curriculum under
19	Section 28.002.
20	(b) Each district program must include:
21	(1) a research-based curriculum designed to guide
22	students toward reading proficiency;
23	(2) assessments that are approved by the agency and
24	designed to measure growth in a student's vocabulary and reading

- 2 (3) computer-based instruction that makes available
- 3 additional reading practice for students participating in the
- 4 program;
- 5 (4) a comprehensive system of support for teachers
- 6 that includes in-person training, access to online professional
- 7 development, and ongoing consultation throughout the school year;
- 8 and
- 9 (5) teacher training materials and other teacher
- 10 training resources, including resource guides, to assist teachers
- 11 in enabling students of limited English proficiency to meet state
- 12 performance expectations, including performance expectations on
- 13 assessment instruments administered under Subchapter B, Chapter
- 14 39.
- 15 <u>(c) The results of assessments required under Subsection</u>
- 16 (b)(2) must be accessible through an Internet data management
- 17 system:
- 18 (1) to appropriate teachers and administrators; and
- 19 (2) in English and Spanish, to the parent of a student
- 20 participating in the program.
- 21 (d) A school district shall begin providing instruction
- 22 under the program to a student of limited English proficiency
- 23 before the student enters the seventh grade.
- 24 (e) A school district shall begin providing instruction
- 25 under the program to students not later than September 30 of each
- 26 school year.
- 27 (f) Not later than January 31 and June 1 of each school year,

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- 1 <u>a school district shall provide to the agency a written report on</u>
- 2 the progress in reading of students participating in the district's
- 3 program.
- 4 SECTION 2. Section 39.024(e), Education Code, is amended to
- 5 read as follows:
- 6 (e) The commissioner shall retain a portion of the total
- 7 amount of funds allotted under Section 42.152(a) that the
- 8 commissioner considers appropriate to finance activities under
- 9 Subsection [Subsections] (c) and may retain a portion for
- 10 activities under <u>Section 29.069</u> [<del>Subsection (d)</del>] and for <u>other</u>
- 11 intensive programs of instruction for students of limited English
- 12 proficiency offered by school districts and shall reduce each
- 13 district's allotment proportionately.
- 14 SECTION 3. Section 39.024(d), Education Code, is repealed.
- SECTION 4. This Act applies beginning with the 2009-2010
- 16 school year.
- 17 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
