4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 74.162, Government Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

Sec. 74.162. TRANSFER OF CASES BY PANEL. Notwithstanding 7 any other law to the contrary, the judicial panel on multidistrict 8 9 litigation may transfer civil actions that are subject to Section 82.007 or Chapter 90, Civil Practice and Remedies Code, and involve 10 11 [involving] one or more common questions of fact pending in the same 12 or different constitutional courts, county courts at law, probate courts, or district courts to any district court for consolidated 13 or coordinated pretrial proceedings, including summary judgment or 14 other dispositive motions, but not for trial on the merits. 15 А 16 transfer may be made by the judicial panel on multidistrict 17 litigation on its determination that the transfer will:

18 (1) be for the convenience of the parties and19 witnesses; and

20 (2) promote the just and efficient conduct of the 21 actions.

22 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only 23 to an action commenced on or after the effective date of this Act. 24 An action that is commenced before the effective date of this Act is

1 governed by the law applicable to the action immediately before the 2 effective date of this Act, and that law is continued in effect for 3 that purpose.

4 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 5 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 6 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 7 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 8 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
