- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Code of Criminal
- 6 Procedure, is amended by adding Article 45.0512 to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 45.0512. DRIVER EDUCATION FOR CERTAIN PERSONS.
- 8 (a) This article applies only to a defendant who has previously
- 9 been convicted two or more times of an offense involving the
- 10 operation of a motor vehicle and commits an offense involving the
- 11 operation of a motor vehicle before the fifth anniversary of the
- 12 <u>earlier of the dates of the two previous convictions.</u>
- 13 (b) The judge may require a defendant described by
- 14 Subsection (a) to complete a driver education course approved under
- 15 Chapter 1001, Education Code, in addition to any other penalty
- 16 authorized by law.
- (c) For purposes of this article, an order of deferral under
- 18 Article 45.051 or a deferral of the imposition of judgment under
- 19 Article 45.0511 is considered a conviction.
- 20 <u>(d) The court shall require the defendant to present</u>
- 21 evidence that the defendant has completed the driver education
- 22 course not later than the 60th day after the date the judgment is
- 23 entered.

(e) If the defendant fails to comply with Subsection (d),

- 1 the court may hold the defendant in contempt of the court and order
- 2 either or both of the following:
- 3 (1) that the defendant pay a fine not to exceed \$500;
- 4 and
- 5 (2) that the Department of Public Safety suspend the
- 6 defendant's driver's license or permit until the defendant fully
- 7 complies with any order of the court issued under this article.
- 8 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 10 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 11 covered by the law in effect immediately before the effective date
- 12 of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that
- 13 purpose. For purposes of this section, an offense was committed
- 14 before the effective date of this Act if any element of the offense
- 15 occurred before that date.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
