## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to licensing requirements for persons who sell, install,
3	service, monitor or respond to certain camera systems.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by
6	amending Section 1702.002 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 1702.002. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
8	(1) "Alarm system" means:
9	(A) electronic equipment and devices designed to
10	detect or signal:
11	(i) an unauthorized entry or attempted
12	entry of a person or object into a residence, business, or area
13	monitored by the system; or
14	(ii) the occurrence of a robbery or other
15	emergency; or
16	(B) electronic equipment and devices using a
17	computer or data processor designed to control the access of a
18	person, vehicle, or object through a door, gate, or entrance into
19	the controlled area of a residence or business; [or
20	[(C) a television camera or still camera system
21	that:
22	(i) records or archives images of property
23	or individuals in a public or private area of a residence or
24	<del>business; or</del>

1 [(ii) is monitored by security personnel or 2 services. 3 (23) "Camera System" means any device or system of devices used to capture still photographs or any 4 sequence of moving images that: are viewable, captured, recorded 5 or archived; or is monitored by security personnel, a security 6 service, or an alarm company; or provides means to view the still 7 8 photographs or sequence of moving images from inside or outside a residence, home or business; or may be used to view, detect, 9 capture, record, or archive possible civil or criminal law 10 violations in public or private places. 11 12 (23-a) For purposes of subdivision (23), the term "Camera System" does not include any device or system 13 14 of devices used to capture electronic pictures or images that is 15 used exclusively for the purpose of viewing and monitoring traffic conditions on public roads; or is used exclusively to detect motor 16 17 vehicle violations on public roads; or is used exclusively for telephone or video conferencing; or is used exclusively to monitor 18 a manufacturing process; or is used exclusively for medical 19 purposes by medical practitioners; or is used exclusively by a 20 courtroom reporter for the purposes of recording and archiving 21 22 depositions or testimonies. SECTION 2. Chapter 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by 23 24 adding Section 1702.1057 to read as follows: Sec. 1702.1057 CAMERA SYSTEMS COMPANY. (a) Unless a person holds a license as a security 25 26 services contractor, a person may not sell, offer to sell, install, service, monitor, or respond to a Camera System. 27

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- 1 SECTION 3. Section 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 2 amending Section 1702.102 to read as follows:
- 3 Sec. 1702.102. SECURITY SERVICES CONTRACTOR LICENSE
- 4 REQUIRED; SCOPE OF LICENSE. (a) Unless the person holds a license
- 5 as a security services contractor, a person may not:
- 6 (1) act as an alarm systems company, armored car
- 7 company, camera systems company, courier company, guard company,
- 8 guard dog company, locksmith company, or private security
- 9 consultant company;
- 10 (2) offer to perform the services of a company in
- 11 Subdivision (1); or
- 12 (3) engage in business activity for which a license is
- 13 required under this chapter.
- 14 SECTION 4. Section 1702, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 15 amending Section 1702.328 to read as follows: Sec. 1702.328.
- 16 SECURITY SYSTEMS SALES AND INSTALLATION. This chapter does not
- 17 apply to:
- 18 (1) a person who owns and installs a burglar detection
- 19 electronic access control device, lock, camera system or alarm
- 20 device on the person's own property or, [if the person does not
- 21 charge for the device or the installation], installs the device for
- 22 the protection of the person's personal property located on another
- 23 person's property and does not, as a normal business practice,
- 24 install the devices on the property of another, and who does not
- 25 perform any other act that requires a license under this chapter;
- 26 (2) a person in the business of building construction
- 27 that installs electrical wiring and devices that may include in

- 1 part the installation of a burglar alarm, electronic access control
- 2 <u>device</u>, <u>lock</u>, <u>camera system</u> or detection device if:
- 3 (A) the person is a party to a contract that
- 4 provides that:
- 5 (i) the installation will be performed,
- 6 [under the direct supervision of, and] inspected and certified by,
- 7 a person licensed to install and certify the alarm, electronic
- 8 access control device, lock, camera system or detection device; and
- 9 (ii) the license holder assumes full
- 10 responsibility for the installation of the alarm or detection
- 11 device; and
- 12 (B) the person does not service or maintain alarm
- 13 systems, electronic access control devices, locks, camera systems
- 14 or detection devices, or any other device or service regulated by
- 15 this chapter;
- 16 (3) a person who sells or installs automobile burglar
- 17 alarm devices and who does not perform any other act that requires a
- 18 license under this chapter; or
- 19 (4) a person who sells exclusively by e-commerce, over
- 20 the counter transactions, or mail order, alarm systems, electronic
- 21 access control devices, locks, or detection devices, and who does
- 22 not perform any other act that requires a license under this
- 23 <u>chapter</u>.
- 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 25 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 26 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 27 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this

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1 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
