A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to a study and report by the Texas Higher Education
3	Coordinating Board regarding achievable cost-saving measures at
4	public institutions of higher education.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
6	SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 61, Education Code, is
7	amended by adding Section 61.0664 to read as follows:
8	Sec. 61.0664. STUDY OF ACHIEVABLE COST-SAVING MEASURES;
9	REPORT. (a) The board shall conduct a study to identify achievable
10	cost-saving measures in the operations of institutions of higher
11	education. The study must include examination of potential
12	cost-savings relating to the following aspects of institutional
13	operations:
14	(1) facility utilization, including scheduling
15	weekend and evening classes;
16	(2) staffing;
17	(3) the delivery of instruction and other educational
18	services, including through distance learning;
19	(4) management practices;
20	(5) efforts to promote timely graduation of students;
21	(6) energy use;
22	(7) purchasing; and
23	(8) facility construction, acquisition, and
24	maintenance.

- 1 (b) Not later than December 1, 2010, the board shall report
- 2 the results of the study required by Subsection (a) to the governor,
- 3 lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of representatives, and
- 4 presiding officer for each legislative standing committee with
- 5 primary jurisdiction over higher education. The report must
- 6 include:
- 7 (1) the board's recommendations concerning
- 8 cost-saving measures that are achievable at institutions of higher
- 9 education; and
- 10 (2) an estimate of the amount of money that would be
- 11 saved during a five-year period through the implementation of each
- 12 <u>recommendation</u>.
- (c) This section expires January 31, 2011.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 15 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 16 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 17 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 18 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
