## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to creation of a volunteer advocate program for certain
- 3 elderly persons.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 48.208(g), Human Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 (g) The court shall appoint an attorney ad litem to
- 8 represent the elderly or disabled person in any proceeding brought
- 9 by the department under this section. A reasonable fee, as
- 10 determined by the court, shall be paid to the attorney ad litem from
- 11 the general fund of the county. <u>If the person is elderly, the court</u>
- 12 may also appoint an individual to serve as a volunteer advocate for
- 13 the person in accordance with the program established under Section
- 14 161.084.
- 15 SECTION 2. Subchapter D, Chapter 161, Human Resources Code,
- 16 is amended by adding Section 161.084 to read as follows:
- Sec. 161.084. VOLUNTEER ADVOCATE PROGRAM FOR THE ELDERLY.
- 18 (a) In this section, "elderly person" means a person 65 years of
- 19 age or older.
- (b) The department may establish a volunteer advocate
- 21 program under which trained individuals serve as volunteer
- 22 advocates for elderly persons subject to:
- 23 (1) guardianship proceedings; or
- 24 (2) proceedings under Section 48.208 in which

- 1 emergency orders are sought authorizing the provision of protective
- 2 services.
- 3 (c) The department may enter into agreements with
- 4 appropriate nonprofit organizations for the provision of services
- 5 under the program. A nonprofit organization is eligible to provide
- 6 services under the program if the organization:
- 7 (1) has significant experience in providing services
- 8 to the elderly;
- 9 (2) has the capacity to provide training and
- 10 supervision for individuals interested in serving as volunteer
- 11 advocates for the elderly; and
- 12 (3) meets any other criteria prescribed by the
- 13 department.
- 14 (d) In developing the program under this section, the
- 15 department shall consider the structure and operation of existing
- 16 programs that provide volunteer advocates for abused or neglected
- 17 children and incorporate any appropriate aspects of those programs.
- 18 (e) The department shall seek and may accept gifts, grants,
- 19 or donations for the program from any public or private source.
- 20 (f) The executive commissioner may adopt rules necessary to
- 21 <u>implement the program.</u>
- SECTION 3. Subpart E, Part 2, Chapter XIII, Texas Probate
- 23 Code, is amended by adding Section 645B to read as follows:
- Sec. 645B. APPOINTMENT OF VOLUNTEER ADVOCATE. In a
- 25 proceeding under this chapter for the appointment of a guardian for
- 26 a proposed ward who is 65 years of age or older, the court may
- 27 appoint an individual to serve as a volunteer advocate for the

- 1 proposed ward in accordance with the program established under
- 2 Section 161.084, Human Resources Code.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
