The department may use volunteer instructors or other 10 (f) agents to minimize the cost of the course. The department may 11 charge a person who enrolls in a boater education course a fee not 12 to exceed \$15. The department by rule may permit a volunteer 13 14 instructor or other agent to collect the fee and to retain a portion 15 of the fee to reimburse the volunteer or other agent for the volunteer's or agent's necessary and reasonable expenses associated 16 17 with teaching the course [An agent acting under authority of Subsection (d): 18

2 SECTION 4. Section 31.110, Parks and Wildlife Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 31.110. EXEMPTION FROM BOATER EDUCATION COURSE
REQUIREMENT. A person is not required to comply with Section 31.109
if the person:

7 (1) holds a master's, mate's, or operator's license8 issued by the United States Coast Guard;

9 (2) is supervised by a person who:

(A) is otherwise exempt from the requirements of
Section 31.109 or possesses a boater identification card as
required by Section 31.109; and

(B) is at least 18 years of age;

(3) [is at least 18 years of age;

15 [(4)] is not a resident of this state and has proof 16 that the person has successfully completed a boater education 17 course or equivalency examination in another state that is approved 18 by the department; or

19 (4) [(5)] is exempt by rule of the department.
20 SECTION 5. Subchapter D, Chapter 31, Parks and Wildlife
21 Code, is amended by adding Section 31.112 to read as follows:

22 Sec. 31.112. FEES. (a) Any fee collected by the department 23 under Section 31.108 shall be deposited in the game, fish, and water 24 safety account established under Section 11.032.

25 (b) Interest earned on money deposited to the credit of the 26 game, fish, and water safety account under Subsection (a) shall be 27 credited to the account.
