A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a pilot program to expand access to career and technical

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 12, Agriculture Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Section 12.0271 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 12.0271. RURAL WORKFORCE INVESTMENT PILOT PROGRAM.
- 8 (a) In this section:
- 9 (1) "General academic teaching institution," "public
- 10 junior college," and "public technical institute" have the meanings
- 11 assigned by Section 61.003, Education Code.
- 12 (2) "Rural area" means:
- 13 (A) a county with a population of less than
- 14 <u>100,000; or</u>
- 15 (B) a municipality with a population of less than
- 16 50,000.

- 17 (b) Subject to available funding, the commissioner by rule
- 18 shall develop a rural workforce investment pilot program to issue
- 19 grants for developing partnerships in rural areas among school
- 20 districts, public junior colleges, public technical institutes,
- 21 general academic teaching institutions, and business and industry
- 22 to provide greater access to career and technical education and
- 23 industry certification to high school students in those areas.
- (c) The department may not issue more than four grants under

- 1 this section in each state fiscal biennium.
- 2 (d) The department shall coordinate with the Texas
- 3 Workforce Commission, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 4 Board, and the Texas Education Agency in developing the pilot
- 5 program.
- 6 (e) Students participating in the pilot program may receive
- 7 <u>at least 60 hours of college credit before high school graduation.</u>
- 8 (f) A local workforce development board authorized by the
- 9 Texas Workforce Commission may apply to participate in the pilot
- 10 program if the workforce development board:
- 11 (1) serves a rural area of the state; and
- 12 (2) meets any other qualifications prescribed by the
- 13 commissioner.
- 14 (g) To receive a grant under this section, an applicant must
- 15 commit public or private funds matching the grant in a percentage
- 16 set by the commissioner. The commissioner shall set the required
- 17 percentage of matching funds based on the demonstrated economic
- 18 capacity of the community served by the program to raise funds for
- 19 the purpose of matching the grant, as determined by the
- 20 commissioner.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
