BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 453.254, Occupations Code, is amended to read as follows:

[MANDATORY] COMPETENCE Sec. 453.254. CONTINUING [EDUCATION]. (a) The board by rule shall:

- (1) [assess the continuing education needs of license holders and adopt requirements for [mandatory] continuing competence [education] for license holders in subjects pertaining to the practice of physical therapy;
- (2) establish a minimum [<del>of hours</del>] of number continuing competence units [education] required to renew a license; and
- (3) develop a process to [<del>evaluate and</del>] approve continuing competence activities [education courses].
- (b) The board may require license holders to complete [attend] continuing competence activities [education courses] specified by the board. The board shall adopt a procedure to assess a license holder's participation and performance in continuing competence activities [education programs].
- (c) The board may [shall] identify the key factors for the competent performance by a license holder of the license holder's professional duties.
- (d) In developing a process under Subsection (a) for the [evaluation and] approval of continuing competence activities [education courses], the board may [shall] authorize appropriate [license holder peer] organizations to [evaluate and] approve the activities [courses in accordance with the established process].
- 1-36 1-37 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 1-38 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution.
