H.B. No. 4301

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

relating to the availability of certain county, municipal, and school district financial information on certain Internet websites.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Chapter 44, Education Code, is amended by adding Subchapter D to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER D. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

Sec. 44.101. APPLICABILITY. This subchapter applies only to a school district with 5,000 or more enrolled students.

Sec. 44.102. ELECTRONIC CHECKING ACCOUNT TRANSACTION REGISTER. (a) A school district shall maintain the transaction register for the district's checking account in a searchable electronic spreadsheet format, such as a portable document format (PDF) or similar file type, in which the transaction register is readily available for purposes of Subsections (e) and (f). Except as provided by Subsection (c) or (d), the electronic checking account transaction register must include for each check written from a district checking account:

(1) the transaction amount;

(2) the name of the payee; and

(3) either:

(A) a statement of the purpose of the expenditure for which the check was written; or

1           (B) identification of the purpose of the  
2 expenditure, using the function code assigned to the expenditure  
3 for purposes of meeting state reporting requirements.

4           (a-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), beginning September  
5 1, 2009, a school district's electronic checking account  
6 transaction register must contain the information required by  
7 Subsections (a)(1) and (2) for each check dated on or after August  
8 1, 2009. Beginning September 1, 2010, a district's electronic  
9 checking account transaction register must contain the information  
10 required by Subsections (a)(1) through (3) for each check dated on  
11 or after August 1, 2010. This subsection expires October 1, 2010.

12           (b) If the school district complies with Subsection (a)(3)  
13 in the manner provided by Subsection (a)(3)(B), the district shall  
14 post on the district's Internet website:

15                 (1) a description of each function code used for state  
16 reporting requirements; or

17                 (2) a link to a page on the agency's Internet website  
18 that describes each function code used for state reporting  
19 requirements.

20           (c) A school district may not include in the district's  
21 electronic checking account transaction register a check issued to  
22 a district employee in payment of:

23                 (1) salary, wages, or an employment stipend; or

24                 (2) a workers' compensation income benefit, medical  
25 benefit, death benefit, or burial benefit that is issued by a school  
26 district operating as a self-insurer under Chapter 504, Labor Code.

27           (d) This section does not apply to a checking account

1 maintained by a school district or school campus solely for a  
2 student activity fund.

3 (e) A school district shall prominently post the electronic  
4 checking account transaction register at all times on the  
5 district's Internet website for viewing and downloading by  
6 interested persons.

7 (f) A school district shall share data from the electronic  
8 checking account transaction register with any interested person  
9 who requests the data.

10 (g) A school district shall:

11 (1) update the electronic checking account  
12 transaction register at least once each month, not later than the  
13 30th day after the closing date of the most recent monthly statement  
14 for the checking account; and

15 (2) maintain each transaction or listing in the  
16 electronic checking account transaction register on the district's  
17 Internet website until the second anniversary of the date of the  
18 transaction or listing.

19 Sec. 44.103. POSTING OF DISTRICT FUND BALANCES. (a) A  
20 school district shall post on the district's Internet website a  
21 statement of the district's obligated and unobligated fund  
22 balances.

23 (b) A school district shall:

24 (1) update the statement of fund balances at least  
25 once each month; and

26 (2) maintain each statement of fund balances on the  
27 district's Internet website until the second anniversary of the

1 date of the statement.

2 SECTION 2. Subtitle C, Title 4, Local Government Code, is  
3 amended by adding Chapter 134 to read as follows:

4 CHAPTER 134. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE

5 Sec. 134.001. APPLICABILITY. This chapter applies only to:

6 (1) a municipality with a population of 15,000 or  
7 more; and

8 (2) a county with a population of 25,000 or more.

9 Sec. 134.002. ELECTRONIC CHECKING ACCOUNT TRANSACTION  
10 REGISTER. (a) The governing body of a municipality or  
11 commissioners court of a county shall maintain the transaction  
12 register for the municipality's or county's checking account in a  
13 searchable electronic spreadsheet format, such as a portable  
14 document format (PDF) or similar file type, in which the  
15 transaction register is readily available for purposes of  
16 Subsections (c) and (d). Except as provided by Subsection (b), the  
17 electronic checking account transaction register must include for  
18 each check written from a municipal or county checking account:

19 (1) the transaction amount;

20 (2) the name of the payee; and

21 (3) a statement of the purpose of the expenditure for  
22 which the check was written.

23 (a-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), beginning September  
24 1, 2009, a municipality's or county's electronic checking account  
25 transaction register must contain the information required by  
26 Subsections (a)(1) and (2) for each check dated on or after August  
27 1, 2009. Beginning September 1, 2010, a municipality's or county's

1 electronic checking account transaction register must contain the  
2 information required by Subsections (a)(1) through (3) for each  
3 check dated on or after August 1, 2010. This subsection expires  
4 October 1, 2010.

5 (b) A municipality or county may not include in the  
6 municipality's or county's electronic checking account transaction  
7 register a check issued to a municipal or county employee in payment  
8 of:

9 (1) salary, wages, or an employment stipend; or

10 (2) a workers' compensation income benefit, medical  
11 benefit, death benefit, or burial benefit that is issued by a school  
12 district operating as a self-insurer under Chapter 504, Labor Code.

13 (c) A municipality or county shall prominently post the  
14 electronic checking account transaction register at all times on  
15 the municipality's or county's Internet website for viewing and  
16 downloading by interested persons.

17 (d) A municipality or county shall share data from the  
18 electronic checking account transaction register with any  
19 interested person who requests the data.

20 (e) A municipality or county shall:

21 (1) update the electronic checking account  
22 transaction register at least once each month, not later than the  
23 30th day after the closing date of the most recent monthly statement  
24 for the checking account; and

25 (2) maintain each transaction or listing in the  
26 electronic checking account transaction register on the  
27 municipality's or county's Internet website until the second

1 anniversary of the date of the transaction or listing.

2 Sec. 134.003. POSTING OF MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY FUND  
3 BALANCES. (a) A municipality or county shall post on the  
4 municipality's or county's Internet website a statement of the  
5 municipality's or county's obligated and unobligated fund balances.

6 (b) A municipality or county shall:

7 (1) update the statement of fund balances at least  
8 once each month; and

9 (2) maintain each statement of fund balances on the  
10 municipality's or county's Internet website until the second  
11 anniversary of the date of the statement.

12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives  
13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as  
14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this  
15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this  
16 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
