# A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

#### AN ACT

2 relating to an interim study on the creation of a data collection to 3 track specialized technology research projects conducted by public 4 universities, public university research facilities, and other 5 state institutions.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. INTERIM STUDY REGARDING TECHNOLOGY RESEARCH DATA 7 COLLECTION. (a) A select interim committee is created to study the 8 9 feasibility of collecting data and maintaining a searchable electronic database, search engine, or other collection of data 10 11 (data collection) relating to specialized technology research 12 projects that are developed or conducted at public universities in this state, research facilities of public universities in this 13 14 state, or other facilities operated by a state agency, in order to facilitate coordination among the universities and facilities on 15 the projects and improve access to and awareness of the specialized 16 research and technologies developed at those institutions and 17 18 facilities.

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#### (b) The study must consider:

(1) appropriate entities to administer the data
collection, including nonprofit organizations, public universities
in this state, or state agencies;

(2) the extent of legislative oversight required for
an entity that would maintain the data collection;

C.S.H.B. No. 4329 1 (3) compliance with state and federal laws regarding access to public information; and 2 3 (4) the information the data collection would include, such as: 4 5 (A) a list of projects involving one or more of the following areas: 6 7 (i) energy research, including methods of 8 creation, storage, distribution, and conservation of energy; (ii) biomedical science research; 9 10 (iii) nanotechnology research, including 11 nanomedicine; and 12 (iv) other specialized technology research; 13 for each project listed under Paragraph (A), 14 (B) 15 a brief description of the project, including the field of technology involved, the entity involved with the project, and 16 17 additional comments regarding the research the board considers appropriate; and 18 (C) other relevant information and available 19 resources in this state relating to specialized technology 20 research, including: 21 22 (i) expert faculty or research personnel; 23 (ii) available technology and patents 24 obtained; 25 (iii) the location of and policies for the use of available research equipment; and 26 27 (iv) public grants or contracts awarded.

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1 (c) The study shall examine the current state of access to 2 public information about specialized technology research projects 3 and shall assess the best methods of facilitating access to the 4 information. In addition, the study shall consider what information 5 should be accessible by the general public and what information, if 6 any, should have restricted access.

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### (d) The committee shall be composed of:

8 (1)representatives of the following institutions, with one member named by each institution: The University of Texas 9 at Austin, Texas A&M University, Texas Tech University, the 10 University of Houston, the University of North Texas, 11 The 12 University of Texas at Arlington, The University of Texas at Dallas, The University of Texas at El Paso, and The University of 13 14 Texas at San Antonio; and

(2) a number of members appointed by the Texas Higher
Education Coordinating Board as the coordinating board considers
appropriate to represent the coordinating board, data collection
providers, and the technology industry.

(e) On the request of the committee, a general academic institution of higher education, research facility of a general academic institution of higher education, or other facility operated by a state agency shall provide to the board or advisory committee any information necessary for the board or advisory committee to perform its duties under this section.

25 SECTION 2. COMMITTEE REPORT. Not later than December 1, 26 2010, the committee shall report the committee's findings and 27 recommendations to the lieutenant governor, the speaker of the

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1 house of representatives, and the governor. The committee shall 2 include in its recommendations specific legislation that the 3 committee considers desirable to address the need for and 4 feasibility of establishing a data collection as determined by the 5 committee's findings.

6 SECTION 3. ABOLITION OF COMMITTEE. The committee is 7 abolished and this Act expires January 16, 2011.

8 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 9 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 10 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 11 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 12 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
