5	SECTION 1. Chapter 447, Government Code, is amended by

7	Sec. 447.014. CENTER FOR SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS. (a) To
8	assist Texas businesses in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and
9	transitioning successfully to a low-carbon economy, the state
10	energy conservation office shall establish and oversee the Texas
11	Center for Sustainable Business.
12	(b) The center shall develop a sustainable business action
13	plan that will provide a balanced assessment of strategies for

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              In developing the sustainable business action plan

   required by Subsection (b), the center shall:
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               (1) work with the Texas Commission on Environmental
   Quality and the United States Environmental Protection Agency to
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   create an accounting of greenhouse gas emissions in this state;
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               (2) determine the total amount of carbon dioxide
   emissions in this state in 2005 and recommend practices,
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   strategies, and policies that will reduce greenhouse gas emissions
   in this state to within a range of 97 percent to 102 percent of 2005
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   levels by 2012, to within a range of 80 percent to 86 percent of 2005
   levels by 2020, to 58 percent of 2005 levels by 2030, and to 20
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   percent of 2005 levels by 2050;
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               (3) establish a registry of actions to reduce carbon
   dioxide emissions that have been taken by Texas businesses since
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   January 1, 2000, and work with the United States Environmental
   Protection Agency to recognize and give credit for early action
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   under federal carbon emissions limits adopted after September 1,
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   2009;
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- 1 (4) identify and prioritize strategies for reducing
- 2 emissions of greenhouse gases in this state that will result in net
- 3 savings or in no additional financial cost to consumers or
- 4 businesses of this state;
- 5 <u>(5) identify, assess, and promote commercialization</u>
- 6 of technology that will achieve the greatest greenhouse gas

- 14 (g) The center annually shall submit a plan to the governor
- 15 and the legislature presenting the assessments and recommendations
- 16 required by Subsection (f).
- 17 SECTION 2. The Texas Center for Sustainable Business is
- 18 eligible to receive grants from the Texas Enterprise Fund to fund
- 19 its duties under Section 447.014, Government Code, as added by this
- 20 Act, during the state fiscal biennium beginning September 1, 2009.
- 21 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 25 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
