- 2 relating to certification of a person as eligible for disabled parking privileges. 3
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 681.001(5), Transportation Code, 5
- amended to read as follows: 6
- 7 "Mobility problem that substantially impairs a
- person's ability to ambulate" means that the person: 8
- 9 (A) cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to
- 10 rest;

- 11 cannot walk without the use of or assistance
- 12 from an assistance device, including a brace, a cane, a crutch,
- another person, or a prosthetic device; 13
- 14 (C) cannot ambulate without a wheelchair οr
- similar device; 15
- is restricted by lung disease to the extent 16 (D)
- that the person's forced respiratory expiratory volume for one 17
- second, measured by spirometry, is less than one liter, or the 18
- arterial oxygen tension is less than 60 millimeters of mercury on 19
- room air at rest; 20
- 21 uses portable oxygen;
- 22 (F) has a cardiac condition to the extent that
- 23 the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as
- Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American 2.4

- 1 Heart Association;
- 2 (G) is severely limited in the ability to walk
- 3 because of an arthritic, neurological, or orthopedic condition;
- 4 (H) has a disorder of the foot that, in the
- 5 opinion of a person licensed to practice podiatry in this state or
- 6 in a state adjacent to this state, limits or impairs the person's
- 7 ability to walk; or
- 8 (I) has another debilitating condition that
- 9 limits or impairs the person's ability to walk, in the opinion of:
- 10 <u>(i)</u> a physician licensed to practice
- 11 medicine in this state or a state adjacent to this state, or
- 12 authorized by applicable law to practice medicine in a hospital or
- 13 other health facility of the Veterans Administration; or
- 14 (ii) a physician assistant licensed to
- 15 practice in this state acting as the agent of a licensed physician
- 16 under Section 204.202(e), Occupations Code[, limits or impairs the
- 17 person's ability to walk].
- 18 SECTION 2. Section 681.003(c), Transportation Code, is
- 19 amended to read as follows:
- 20 (c) Subject to Subsection (e), the first application must be
- 21 accompanied by a notarized written statement or written
- 22 prescription of a physician licensed to practice medicine in this
- 23 state or a state adjacent to this state $[\tau]$ or authorized by
- 24 applicable law to practice medicine in a hospital or other health
- 25 facility of the Veterans Administration or a physician assistant
- 26 licensed to practice in this state acting as the agent of a licensed
- 27 physician under Section 204.202(e), Occupations Code, certifying

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- 1 and providing evidence acceptable to the department that the person
- 2 making the application or on whose behalf the application is made is
- 3 legally blind or has a mobility problem that substantially impairs
- 4 the person's ability to ambulate. The statement or prescription
- 5 must include a certification of whether the disability is temporary
- 6 or permanent and information acceptable to the department to
- 7 determine the type of disabled parking placard for which the
- 8 applicant is eligible. The department shall determine a person's
- 9 eligibility based on evidence provided by the applicant
- 10 establishing legal blindness or mobility impairment.
- 11 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 15 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
