- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 43, Election Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 43.007 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 43.007. COUNTYWIDE VOTING CENTERS. (a) A county may
- 8 conduct its elections under this section as an alternative to the
- 9 general election provisions of this chapter.
- 10 (b) The secretary of state shall establish rules for
- 11 counties to allow a commissioners court to eliminate county
- 12 election precincts and establish countywide voting centers for:
- (1) each general election for state and county
- 14 officers;

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- 15 (2) each countywide election held on the uniform
- 16 election date in May; and
- 17 (3) each election of a political subdivision located
- 18 in the county that is held jointly with an election described by
- 19 <u>Subdivision (1) or (2).</u>
- 20 <u>(c) The commissioners court of a county that desires to use</u>
- 21 countywide voting centers as an alternative election system shall
- 22 hold a public hearing on the proposed election system change. The
- 23 county shall make a reasonable effort to provide notice of the
- 24 hearing to other political subdivisions within the jurisdiction of

- 1 the county. A county that has previously used countywide voting
- 2 centers as an alternative election system is not required to hold a
- 3 hearing under this subsection.
- 4 (d) At the request of the commissioners court, the secretary
- 5 of state may provide for an audit of the direct recording electronic
- 6 voting units before and after the election, and during the election
- 7 to the extent such an audit is practicable.
- 8 (e) The secretary of state by rule shall require a county
- 9 that desires to use the alternative election system to:
- 10 (1) implement a computerized voter registration list
- 11 that allows an election officer at the voting center to verify that
- 12 a voter has not previously voted in the election;
- 13 (2) use direct recording electronic voting machines or
- 14 other state-certified voting equipment that has the appropriate
- 15 capabilities to permit the use of countywide voting centers; and
- 16 (3) document that the county possesses the appropriate
- 17 technological capabilities as determined by the secretary of state.
- 18 (f) Each countywide voting center must allow a voter to vote
- 19 in the same elections in which the voter would be entitled to vote
- 20 in the county election precinct in which the voter resides.
- 21 (g) In selecting countywide voting centers, a county must
- 22 adopt a methodology for determining where each voting center will
- 23 <u>be located</u>. The total number of countywide voting centers may not
- 24 be less than 50 percent of the number of precinct polling places
- 25 that would otherwise be located in the county under this chapter.
- 26 (h) A county opting to use this alternative election system
- 27 for the first time must establish a plan to provide notice informing

- 1 voters of the changes made to the locations of polling places under
- 2 the program. The plan must require that notice of the location of
- 3 the nearest countywide voting center be posted on election day at
- 4 each polling place used in the previous general election for state
- 5 and county officers that is not used as a countywide voting center.
- 6 (i) In creating the plan under Subsection (h), the county
- 7 may solicit input from organizations located within the county who
- 8 represent minority voters.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 32.002, Election Code, is amended by
- 10 adding Subsection (g) to read as follows:
- 11 (g) If election precincts are replaced with countywide
- 12 voting centers under the alternative election system permitted by
- 13 Section 43.007, the commissioners court shall make a reasonable
- 14 effort to appoint the election judges for each voting center from
- 15 among the judges appointed for the precincts located in the area
- 16 served by the voting center.
- SECTION 3. Section 85.001, Election Code, is amended by
- 18 adding Subsection (f) to read as follows:
- 19 (f) A county that implements countywide voting centers
- 20 under Section 43.007 may extend the early voting period so that the
- 21 period for early voting by personal appearance begins on the 17th
- 22 day before election day and continues through the day before
- 23 <u>election day.</u>
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
