2-29 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 2-30 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 2-31 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 2-32 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 2-33 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.

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
