5	SECTION 1. Subtitle E, Title 8, Insurance Code, is amended
6	by adding Chapter 1380 to read as follows:
7	CHAPTER 1380. SUPPLEMENTAL OR LIMITED COVERAGE PLANS
8	Sec. 1380.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter, "supplemental
9	or limited coverage" does not include coverage that is mandated by
10	federal law or standard provisions or rights required under this
11	code or other laws of this state to be provided in an evidence of
12	coverage that are unrelated to a specific health illness, injury,
13	or condition of an enrollee, including provisions related to:
14	(1) continuation of coverage under Subchapter G,
15	<u>Chapter 1251;</u>
16	(2) termination of coverage under Sections 1202.051
17	and 1501.108;
18	(3) preexisting conditions under Subchapter D,
19	<pre>Chapter 1201, and Sections 1501.102-1501.105;</pre>
20	(4) coverage of children and students, including
21	newborn or adopted children, under:
22	(A) Chapter 1503;
23	(B) Chapter 1504;
24	(C) Section 1501.157;

1	(D) Section 1501.158; and
2	(E) Sections 1501.607-1501.609;
3	(5) services of providers under Section 843.304;
4	(6) coverage for serious mental health illness under
5	Subchapter A, Chapter 1355; and
6	(7) coverage for cancer screenings under:
7	(A) Chapter 1356;
8	(B) Chapter 1362;
9	(C) Chapter 1363; and
10	(D) Chapter 1370.
11	Sec. 1380.002. EXEMPTION. Notwithstanding any other law,
12	Section 1507.053 does not apply to a supplemental or limited
13	coverage health benefit plan.
14	SECTION 2. This Act applies only to an insurance policy or
15	contract or evidence of coverage that is delivered, issued for
16	delivery, or renewed on or after January 1, 2010. An insurance
17	policy or contract or evidence of coverage delivered, issued for
18	delivery, or renewed before January 1, 2010, is governed by the law
19	as it existed immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
20	that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
21	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
