A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the transmission of information regarding public school students through the use of radio frequency identification 3 4 technology. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter Z, Chapter 25, Education Code, is 6 7 amended by adding Section 25.903 to read as follows: Sec. 25.903. CERTAIN MANDATORY STUDENT IDENTIFICATION 8 9 METHODS PROHIBITED. (a) In this section, "radio frequency identification technology" means a wireless identification system 10 that uses an electromagnetic radio frequency signal to transmit 11 12 data without physical contact between a card, badge, or tag and another device. 13 14 (b) A school district may not require a student to use an identification device that uses radio frequency identification 15 16 technology or similar technology to identify the student, transmit information regarding the student, or track the location of the 17 student. 18 (c) A school district that permits the voluntary use of a 19 student identification device described by Subsection (b) shall 20 provide an alternative method of identification for a student if 21 the student's parent or guardian submits timely written objection 22 23 to the use of radio frequency identification technology. 24 SECTION 2. 2 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 3 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 4 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 5 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 6 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
