6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only 7 to a case filed with the clerk of a court that has an official court 8 reporter on or after the effective date of this Act. A case filed 9 with the clerk of the court before the effective date of this Act is 10 governed by the law as it existed immediately before the effective 11 date of this Act, and the former law is continued in effect for that 12 purpose.

13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 14 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as 15 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this 16 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this 17 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
