## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

Τ	AN ACT
2	relating to certain diseases or illnesses suffered by certain
3	emergency first responders.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 607, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
7	SUBCHAPTER C. OTHER DISEASES OR ILLNESSES SUFFERED BY FIREFIGHTERS
8	AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIANS
9	Sec. 607.101. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
10	(1) "Disability" means partial or total disability.
11	(2) "Emergency medical technician" means an
12	individual who is certified as an emergency medical technician by
13	the Department of State Health Services as provided by Chapter 773,
14	Health and Safety Code, and who is a full-time employee of a
15	<pre>political subdivision.</pre>
16	(3) "Firefighter" means an individual who is defined
17	as fire protection personnel under Section 419.021 and is a
18	full-time employee of a political subdivision.
19	Sec. 607.102. NOTIFICATION. A firefighter or emergency
20	medical technician who is exposed to methicillin-resistant
21	staphylococcus aureus is entitled to receive notification of the
22	exposure in the manner prescribed by Section 81.048, Health and
23	Safety Code.
24	Sec. 607.103. PRESUMPTION. A firefighter or emergency

- 1 medical technician who contracts methicillin-resistant
- 2 staphylococcus aureus resulting in illness or death is presumed to
- 3 have suffered the illness or death during the course and scope of
- 4 employment if the firefighter or emergency medical technician while
- 5 on duty:
- 6 (1) was exposed to a person diagnosed with
- 7 methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus who received medical
- 8 treatment from the firefighter or emergency medical technician; or
- 9 (2) participated in a training exercise involving the
- 10 use of equipment contaminated or suspected to be contaminated with
- 11 methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus.
- 12 Sec. 607.104. EFFECT OF PRESUMPTION. A presumption
- 13 established under this subchapter applies to a determination of
- 14 whether a firefighter's or emergency medical technician's
- 15 disability or death resulted from a disease or illness contracted
- 16 in the course and scope of employment for purposes of benefits or
- 17 compensation provided under another employee benefit law or plan,
- 18 including a pension plan.
- 19 Sec. 607.105. PRESUMPTION REBUTTABLE. A presumption under
- 20 this subchapter may be rebutted through a showing by a
- 21 preponderance of the evidence that a risk factor, accident, hazard,
- 22 or other cause not associated with the individual's service as a
- 23 firefighter or emergency medical technician caused the
- 24 individual's disease or illness.
- Sec. 607.106. PROHIBITED PAYMENT. No payment shall be made
- 26 to the subsequent injury fund under Section 403.007, Labor Code,
- 27 for any death resulting from a disease or illness presumed to have

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- 1 been contracted in the course and scope of employment under this
- 2 <u>subchapter.</u>
- 3 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
- 4 claim for benefits or compensation brought on or after the
- 5 effective date of this Act. A claim for benefits or compensation
- 6 brought before that date is covered by the law in effect on the date
- 7 the claim was made, and that law is continued in effect for that
- 8 purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
