8	may require a person whose activities cause emissions of air
9	contaminants to submit information to enable the commission to
10	develop an inventory of emissions of air contaminants in this
11	state.
12	(b) The commission shall use emissions information gathered
13	during commission activities to evaluate the integrity of emissions
14	factors and the emissions inventory.
15	(c) The commission shall annually assess the information
16	collected and recommend emissions inventory improvement strategies
17	in the report required by Section 5.126, Water Code.
18	SECTION 2. Section 382.016, Health and Safety Code, is
19	amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
20	(c) The agency may measure and monitor the emissions of air
21	contaminants from a source or from an activity causing or resulting
22	in the emission of air contaminants subject to the commission's
23	jurisdiction.
24	SECTION 3. Section 382.0173 is amended by adding Subsection

(h) to read as follows: 1 (h) The commission shall pursue the permanent reduction of 2 any surplus and quantifiable emissions that are found through the 3 4 use of any advanced technologies authorized under this chapter to gain credits to the State Implementation Plan. 5 6 SECTION 4. Section 382.021, Health and Safety Code, is 7 amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: (c) The commission shall use technology that implements 8 optical gas imaging in two-dimensional vertical fields or other 9 technologies that the commission finds will measure emission 10 concentrations to measure the concentration and the volume of 11 volatile organic compounds and oxides of nitrogen emissions. 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009. 13
