## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to the authority of the Commission on State Emergency3 Communication to determine the 9-1-1 service fee.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Sec. 771.071(b), Health & Safety Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (b) The amount of the fee may not exceed [50] <u>40</u> cents a 8 month for each line.

9 SECTION 2. Sec. 771.0711(b), Health & Safety Code, is 10 amended to read as follows:

(b) A wireless service provider shall collect the fee in an 11 12 amount equal to [50] 40 cents a month for each wireless telecommunications connection from its subscribers and shall pay 13 14 the money collected to the comptroller not later than the 30th day after the last day of the month during which the fees were 15 16 collected. The comptroller may establish alternative dates for payment of fees under this section. The wireless service provider 17 may retain an administrative fee of one percent of the amount 18 collected. The comptroller shall deposit the money from the fees to 19 the credit of the 9-1-1 services fee account. Until deposited to 20 21 the credit of the 9-1-1 services fee account as required by Subsection (c), money the comptroller collects under this 22 23 subsection remains in a trust fund with the state treasury.

24 SECTION 3. This Act applies only to fees imposed on or after

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1 the effective date of this Act. Fees imposed before that date are 2 governed by the law in effect on the date the fees were imposed, and 3 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.

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4 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
