## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to funding for career and technology education programs in
- 3 public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 42.154, Education Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsections (a) and (c) and adding Subsections (c-1) and
- 7 (c-2) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) For each full-time equivalent student in average daily
- 9 attendance in an approved career and technology education program
- 10 in grades <u>eight</u> [nine] through 12 or in career and technology
- 11 education programs for students with disabilities in grades seven
- 12 through 12, a district is entitled to an annual allotment equal to
- 13 the adjusted basic allotment multiplied by a weight of 1.35.
- 14 (c) Except as provided by Subsection (c-1), funds [Funds]
- 15 allocated under this section, other than an indirect cost allotment
- 16 established under State Board of Education rule, <u>may</u> [<u>must</u>] be used
- 17 <u>only to provide</u> [<u>in providing</u>] career and technology education
- 18 programs in grades <u>eight</u> [nine] through 12 or career and technology
- 19 education programs for students with disabilities in grades seven
- 20 through 12 under Sections 29.182, 29.183, and 29.184.
- 21 <u>(c-1)</u> Because career and technical student organizations
- 22 are an integral part of a career and technology education program,
- 23 funds allocated under this section may also be used to provide
- 24 funding to students and teachers for participation in activities

- 1 related to career and technical student organizations that are
- 2 supported by the agency and the State Board of Education.
- 3 (c-2) A school district is entitled to additional funding to
- 4 reimburse district costs related to:
- 5 (1) administering to students assessment instruments
- 6 required for licensure, certification, or credit;
- 7 (2) training to prepare teachers to teach a career and
- 8 technology education course, including costs associated with
- 9 <u>certification examinations, continuing education courses</u>, or other
- 10 incentives approved by the agency; and
- 11 (3) defraying the start-up costs associated with the
- 12 development of new career and technology education programs that
- 13 prepare students for career employment in occupations that are
- 14 identified by the agency as being in high-demand high technology
- 15 <u>industries</u>.
- SECTION 2. Section 42.154(a-1), Education Code, is
- 17 repealed.
- SECTION 3. This Act applies beginning with the 2011-2012
- 19 school year.
- 20 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 21 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 22 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 23 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 24 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
