14	(3) the name of each license holder whose license has

18	or personal identification certificate.
19	SECTION 2. Section 521.101, Transportation Code, is amended
20	by amending Subsection (f) and adding Subsections (d-1), (f-1),

5 A certificate issued to an applicant who is a citizen of (f) the United States expires on a date specified by the department, 6 7 except that a certificate issued to a person 60 years of age or 8 older does not expire.

9 (f-1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States must present to the department documentation issued by the United States 10 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration that authorizes 11 12 the applicant to be in the United States.

(f-2) The department may not issue an identification 13 14 certificate to an applicant:

15 (1) who fails or refuses to comply with Subsection 16 (f-1); or

17 (2) whose lawful admission period in the United States expires before the 180th day after the application date. 18

19 (f-3) An identification certificate issued to an applicant who is not a citizen of the United States expires on the earlier of: 20

21 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission period in the United States expires; or 22

23 (2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance. 24 (f-4) In addition to a certificate issued under this section, Subsections (f-1), (f-2), and (f-3) apply to a personal 25 26 identification certificate for which application is made under

Section 521.103. 27

Section 521.121(a), Transportation Code, is amended to read as follows: 2 The driver's license must include: 3 (a) 4 (1) a distinguishing number assigned by the department 5 to the license holder; (2) a color photograph of the entire face of the 6 holder; 7 8 (3) the full name, date of birth, and residence 9 address of the holder; [and] 10 (4) a brief description of the holder; and (5) a statement as to whether the holder is a citizen 11 12 of the United States. SECTION 4. Section 521.142, Transportation Code, is amended 13 14 by amending Subsection (e) and adding Subsections (e-1) and (e-2) 15 to read as follows: 16 (e) The application must include any other information the 17 department requires to determine the applicant's identity, residency, competency, and eligibility. 18 19 (e-1) A person who is not a citizen of the United States must present to the department documentation issued by the United States 20 agency responsible for citizenship and immigration that authorizes 21 the applicant to be in the United States. 22 (e-2) The department may not issue a license to an 23 24 applicant: 25 (1) who fails or refuses to comply with Subsection 26 (e-1); or 27 (2) whose lawful admission period in the United States

2 SECTION 5. Section 521.1425, Transportation Code, is 3 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (c) to 4 read as follows:

5 (a) Except as provided by <u>Subsections</u> [Subsection] (b) and 6 (c), the department may require each applicant for an original, 7 renewal, or duplicate driver's license to furnish to the department 8 the information required by Section 521.142.

9 (c) Unless the information has been previously provided to 10 the department, the department shall require each applicant for an 11 original, renewal, or duplicate driver's license to furnish to the 12 department:

13(1) proof of the applicant's United States14citizenship; or

15 (2) documentation described by Section 521.142(e-1).
16 SECTION 6. Section 521.271, Transportation Code, is amended

Sec. 521.271. LICENSE EXPIRATION. (a) Each original driver's license, [and] provisional license, or occupational license issued to an applicant who is a citizen of the United States expires as follows:

(1) except as provided by Section 521.2711, a driver's
license expires on the first birthday of the license holder
occurring after the sixth anniversary of the date of the
application;

SECTION 7. Section 521.2711, Transportation 17 is Code, amended by adding Subsection (c) to read as follows: 18 19 (c) Notwithstanding Subsections (a) and (b), an original or renewal driver's license issued to an applicant who is 85 years of 20 age or older and not a citizen of the United States expires on the 21 earlier of: 22 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission 23 24 period in the United States expires; or 25 (2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance. SECTION 8. Section 521.272, Transportation Code, is amended 26 by amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsection (d) to read as 27

Notwithstanding Section 521.271, a driver's license 2 (c) issued under this section to an applicant who is a citizen of the 3 United States, including a renewal, duplicate, or corrected 4 5 license, expires on the first birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of application, except that the initial 6 license issued under this section expires on the second birthday of 7 8 the license holder occurring after the date of application. 14 (d) A driver's license issued under this section to an 15 applicant who is not a citizen of the United States expires on the 16 earlier of:

20 SECTION 9. Subchapter R, Chapter 521, Transportation Code, 21 is amended by adding Section 521.428 to read as follows:

22 <u>Sec. 521.428. FEES FOR LICENSE OR PERSONAL IDENTIFICATION</u> 23 <u>CERTIFICATE ISSUED TO PERSON NOT CITIZEN OF UNITED STATES. (a)</u> 24 <u>Notwithstanding Sections 521.421 and 521.422, the department by</u> 25 <u>rule shall establish the amount of the fee for issuance of a license</u> 26 <u>or personal identification certificate issued to an applicant who</u> 27 is not a citizen of the United States.

1 (b) The amount of the fee may not exceed the amount of the 2 fee otherwise imposed by this subchapter or the amount that is 3 sufficient, when added to other fees collected under this chapter, 4 to recover the actual costs to the department of issuing the license 5 or certificate.

6 SECTION 10. Section 522.021(c), Transportation Code, is 7 amended to read as follows:

8 (c) The application must meet the requirements of an 9 application under <u>Sections</u> [Section] 521.141, 521.142, and 10 <u>521.1425</u> and [must] be accompanied by the fee required under 11 Section 522.029. The department may require documentary evidence 12 to verify the information required by <u>this section</u> [Subsection 13 (a)].

14 SECTION 11. Section 522.029, Transportation Code, is 15 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (l) to 16 read as follows:

17 (a) The fee for a commercial driver's license or commercial
18 driver learner's permit issued by the department is \$60, except as
19 provided by Subsections (f), (h), [and] (j), and (1).

(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, 20 the department by rule shall establish the amount of the fee for 21 issuance of a commercial driver's license or commercial driver 22 learner's permit issued to an applicant who is not a citizen of the 23 24 United States. The amount of the fee may not exceed the amount of the fee otherwise imposed by this subchapter or the amount that is 25 26 sufficient, when added to other fees collected under this chapter, to recover the actual costs to the department of issuing the license 27

1 or certificate. 2 SECTION 12. Section 522.030, Transportation Code, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 Sec. 522.030. CONTENT OF LICENSE. A commercial driver's 5 license must: (1) be marked "Commercial Driver License" or "CDL"; 6 7 be, to the extent practicable, tamper-proof; and (2) 8 (3) include: 9 (A) the name and mailing address of the person to whom it is issued; 10 the person's color photograph; 11 (B) 12 (C) a physical description of the person, including sex, height, and eye color; 13 14 (D) the person's date of birth; 15 (E) a number or identifier the department considers appropriate; 16 17 (F) the person's signature; each class of commercial motor vehicle that (G) 18 the person is authorized to drive, with any endorsements or 19 restrictions; 20 (H) the name of this state; [and] 21 22 (I) the dates between which the license is valid; 23 and 24 (J) a statement as to whether the person is a 25 citizen of the United States. SECTION 13. Section 522.033, Transportation Code, 26 is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c) to

(b) Notwithstanding Section 522.051, a commercial driver's 2 license or commercial driver learner's permit issued under this 3 section to an applicant who is a citizen of the United States, 4 5 including a renewal, duplicate, or corrected license, expires on the first birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of 6 application, except that the initial license issued under this 7 8 section expires on the second birthday of the license holder occurring after the date of application. 9

10 (c) A commercial driver's license or commercial driver 11 learner's permit issued under this section to an applicant who is 12 not a citizen of the United States expires on the earlier of:

13 (1) the date that the applicant's lawful admission
14 period in the United States expires; or

(2) the first anniversary of the date of issuance.

SECTION 14. Section 522.052, Transportation Code, is amended by adding Subsection (h) to read as follows:

18 (h) Unless the information has been previously provided to 19 the department, the department shall require each applicant for a 20 renewal or duplicate commercial driver's license to furnish to the 21 department:

## 22 (1) proof of the applicant's United States 23 <u>citizenship; or</u> 24 (2) documentation described by Section 521.142(e-1).

 25 SECTION 15. The changes in law made by this Act apply only
 26 to a driver's license, personal identification certificate,
 27 commercial driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit

1 issued or renewed on or after the effective date of this Act. A 2 driver's license, personal identification certificate, commercial 3 driver's license, or commercial driver learner's permit issued or 4 renewed before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law 5 in effect when the license, certificate, or permit was issued, and 6 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.

7 SECTION 16. This Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
