H.B. No. 4749

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

1
2 relating to the authority of the Harris-Montgomery Counties
3 Municipal Utility District No. 386, formerly known as Harris County
4 Municipal Utility District No. 386, to issue bonds supported by ad
5 valorem taxes to finance recreational facilities.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

7 SECTION 1. Section 6, Chapter 1381, Acts of the 77th
8 Legislature, Regular Session, 2001, is amended by adding Subsection
9 (d) to read as follows:

10 (d) Section 49.4645(f), Water Code, does not apply to the
11 district.

12 SECTION 2. The Harris-Montgomery Counties Municipal
13 Utility District No. 386, formerly known as Harris County Municipal
14 Utility District No. 386, retains all the rights, powers,
15 privileges, authority, duties, and functions that it had before the
16 effective date of this Act.

17 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
18 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
19 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
20 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
21 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
22 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
23 Government Code.

24 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has

1 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
2 Environmental Quality.

3 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
4 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
5 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
6 representatives within the required time.

7 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
8 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
9 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
10 and accomplished.

11 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
12 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
13 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
14 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
15 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
