## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT
2	relating to the board of directors of the Red Bluff Water Power
3	Control District.
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Title 6, Special District Local Laws Code, is
6	amended by adding Subtitle M to read as follows:
7	SUBTITLE M. WATER POWER CONTROL DISTRICTS
8	CHAPTER 9701. RED BLUFF WATER POWER CONTROL DISTRICT
9	SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL PROVISIONS
10	Sec. 9701.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:
11	(1) "Director" means a member of the Red Bluff board.
12	(2) "Member district" means the following water
13	improvement districts and irrigation districts:
14	(A) Loving County Water Improvement District No.
15	<u>1;</u>
16	(B) Pecos County Water Improvement District No.
17	<u>2;</u>
18	(C) Pecos County Water Improvement District No.
19	<u>3;</u>
20	(D) Reeves County Water Improvement District No.
21	<u>2;</u>
22	(E) Ward County Irrigation District No. 1;
23	(F) Ward County Irrigation District No. 3; and
24	(G) Ward County Water Improvement District No. 2.

- 1 (3) "Red Bluff Board" means the board of directors of
- 2 the Red Bluff District.
- 3 (4) "Red Bluff District" means the Red Bluff Water
- 4 Power Control District.
- 5 Sec. 9701.002. NATURE OF DISTRICT. The Red Bluff District
- 6 is a water power control district in Loving, Pecos, Reeves, and Ward
- 7 Counties, created under and essential to accomplish the purposes of
- 8 Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution.
- 9 Sec. 9701.003. DISTRICT TYPES ELIGIBLE FOR MEMBERSHIP. A
- 10 member district may be a water improvement district operating under
- 11 Chapter 55, Water Code, or an irrigation district operating under
- 12 Chapter 58, Water Code.
- 13 Sec. 9701.004. TERRITORY OF RED BLUFF DISTRICT. The
- 14 territory of the Red Bluff District is only that territory included
- 15 <u>in the combined territory of the member districts.</u>
- [Sections 9701.005-9701.050 reserved for expansion]
- 17 SUBCHAPTER B. ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS
- 18 Sec. 9701.051. APPOINTED BOARD OF DIRECTORS. (a) The Red
- 19 Bluff District is governed by a board of seven directors.
- 20 (b) The governing body of each member district shall appoint
- 21 one director to serve on the Red Bluff board. Each director
- 22 represents the member district from which the director was
- 23 appointed and serves at the pleasure of the governing body of that
- 24 member district.
- 25 (c) A person who holds an elected office of a political
- 26 subdivision in the Red Bluff District may be appointed to serve as a
- 27 director of the Red Bluff District without incurring a penalty or

- 1 forfeiting the office unless the Texas Constitution so requires.
- 2 (d) If a vacancy occurs on the Red Bluff board, the member
- 3 district that appointed the director to the vacated position shall
- 4 appoint a person to fill the vacancy.
- 5 (e) Except as provided by this subsection, directors serve
- 6 staggered terms of six years. The initially appointed directors
- 7 shall draw lots to begin the staggering so that one or two directors
- 8 are appointed every two years. A director may not be appointed to
- 9 or serve more than one term of office.
- 10 Sec. 9701.052. COMPENSATION; REIMBURSEMENT. A director is
- 11 not entitled to compensation for performing the duties of a
- 12 director, but is entitled to reimbursement of expenses necessarily
- 13 incurred in performing the duties of a director.
- 14 Sec. 9701.053. DIRECTOR AS ACTING GENERAL MANAGER. A
- 15 director may serve as the acting general manager of the district
- 16 <u>only:</u>
- 17 (1) during the initial establishment of the appointed
- 18 Red Bluff board; or
- 19 (2) for a period not to exceed six months if a vacancy
- 20 occurs in the position of general manager.
- 21 Sec. 9701.054. ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING. As soon as
- 22 practicable after all the initially appointed directors have
- 23 qualified under Section 49.055, Water Code, the directors shall
- 24 meet at a location in the Red Bluff District agreeable to a majority
- 25 of the directors. At the meeting, the directors shall elect
- 26 officers from among the directors and conduct any other district
- 27 business.

- 2 SUBCHAPTER C. POWERS AND DUTIES
- 3 Sec. 9701.101. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES. The Red Bluff
- 4 District has all of the rights, powers, privileges, authority,
- 5 functions, and duties provided by the general law of this state,
- 6 including Chapters 49 and 51, Water Code, Chapter 76, General Laws,
- 7 Acts of the 43rd Legislature, Regular Session, 1933 (Article 7807d,
- 8 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), and Chapter 19, General Laws, Acts
- 9 of the 43rd Legislature, 1st Called Session, 1933 (Article 7807dd,
- 10 Vernon's Texas Civil Statutes), applicable to water power control
- 11 districts created under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas
- 12 Constitution.
- SECTION 2. (a) In this section, "member district" has the
- 14 meaning assigned by Section 9701.001, Special District Local Laws
- 15 Code, as added by this Act.
- 16 (b) Not later than the 60th day after the later of the
- 17 effective date of this Act or the date on which this Act is
- 18 precleared under Section 5, Voting Rights Act of 1965 (42 U.S.C.
- 19 Section 1973c), the board of directors of each member district
- 20 shall appoint a director to the board of the Red Bluff Water Power
- 21 Control District and file the certificate of appointment with the
- 22 board of the Red Bluff Water Power Control District.
- 23 (c) On the date a director's certificate of appointment is
- 24 filed under Subsection (b) of this section, a director appointed
- 25 under Subsection (b) of this section replaces the director elected
- 26 to represent the same member district.
- 27 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to

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- 1 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 2 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 3 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 4 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 5 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 6 Government Code.
- 7 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 8 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on
- 9 Environmental Quality.
- 10 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 11 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
- 12 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 13 representatives within the required time.
- 14 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 15 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
- 16 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
- 17 and accomplished.
- 18 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 19 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 20 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 21 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 22 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
