## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the election of the members of the Board of Port
- 3 Commissioners of the Port of Port Arthur Navigation District of
- 4 Jefferson County.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 9, Chapter 197, Acts of the 58th
- 7 Legislature, Regular Session, 1963, is amended by amending
- 8 Subsections (a), (c), and (d) and adding Subsections (e) and (f) to
- 9 read as follows:
- 10 (a) The District shall hold an election in the District to
- 11 elect the appropriate number of commissioners on the uniform
- 12 <u>election date in [first Saturday of</u>] May in each odd-numbered year
- 13 [at which time there shall be elected five (5) Port Commissioners].
- (c) Except as provided by Subsection (f)  $[\frac{d}{d}]$  of this
- 15 section, the commissioners serve staggered six-year [four-year]
- 16 terms.
- 17 (d) Four commissioners are elected from single-member
- 18 districts and one commissioner is elected at large [At the
- 19 commissioner's election held in 1991, five commissioners shall be
- 20 elected. Those elected shall draw lots to determine which two
- 21 commissioners will serve two-year terms and which three
- 22 commissioners will serve four-year terms. At the election held in
- 23 1993, two commissioners shall be elected. Those commissioners and
- 24 commissioners elected at subsequent elections serve four-year

- 1 terms].
- 2 (e) Before November 30, 2010, the board of commissioners of
- 3 the Port of Port Arthur Navigation District of Jefferson County,
- 4 Texas, shall create four single-member precincts for the election
- 5 of commissioners and establish the boundaries of each single-member
- 6 precinct and the position that will serve each precinct. The
- 7 precincts are subject to the approval of any state or federal agency
- 8 that regulates an election.
- 9 (f) The commissioners shall determine the date that the term
- 10 for each of the four single-member precincts and the at-large
- 11 position expires by drawing lots for 2011, 2013, and 2015. At the
- 12 2011 election, two commissioners shall be elected to serve terms of
- 13 six years and one commissioner shall be elected to serve a term of
- 14 four years. At the 2013 election, two commissioners shall be
- 15 elected to serve terms of six years. At the election held in 2015,
- one commissioner shall be elected to serve a term of six years.
- 17 SECTION 2. A commissioner on the effective date of this Act
- 18 may continue in office until a successor is elected and qualified.
- 19 SECTION 3. (a) The legal notice of the intention to
- 20 introduce this Act, setting forth the general substance of this
- 21 Act, has been published as provided by law, and the notice and a
- 22 copy of this Act have been furnished to all persons, agencies,
- 23 officials, or entities to which they are required to be furnished
- 24 under Section 59, Article XVI, Texas Constitution, and Chapter 313,
- 25 Government Code.
- 26 (b) The governor, one of the required recipients, has
- 27 submitted the notice and Act to the Texas Commission on

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- 1 Environmental Quality.
- 2 (c) The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality has filed
- 3 its recommendations relating to this Act with the governor, the
- 4 lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of
- 5 representatives within the required time.
- 6 (d) All requirements of the constitution and laws of this
- 7 state and the rules and procedures of the legislature with respect
- 8 to the notice, introduction, and passage of this Act are fulfilled
- 9 and accomplished.
- 10 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2009.
