CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, A gifted opera singer, Barbara Smith Conrad has been
delighting audiences for the past four decades, achieving worldwide
acclaim and recognition; and

WHEREAS, Raised in the East Texas community of Center Point, 4 5 Barbara Smith began exploring music as a child; she and her siblings practiced playing a variety of genres on their family's piano, from 6 7 sonatas by Mozart to the gospel hymns they heard at their local Baptist church; she went on to attend The University of Texas at 8 Austin, and as a sophomore, she won the lead role in the campus 9 production of Dido and Aeneas; however, in an incident that drew 10 11 national attention, Ms. Smith was advised by school administrators 12 that she could not perform in the opera; despite an offer from actor Harry Belafonte to underwrite her studies at the institution of her 13 14 choice, she chose to remain at the university and earned her bachelor's degree in music from UT in 1959; and 15

WHEREAS, Pursuing a career as a vocalist in the years that 16 followed, she took her father's first name, Conrad, and toured with 17 various opera groups; in 1977, she was cast as Marian Anderson in 18 the ABC television movie, Eleanor and Franklin: The White House 19 20 Years; she also garnered praise for her work in the Houston Grand 21 Opera production of Carmen, and she became a performer with the prestigious Metropolitan Opera from 1982 to 1989; this exceptional 22 23 mezzo-soprano continued to play leading roles with the Vienna State Opera, New York City Opera, Teatro Nacional de Venezuela, 24

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Pittsburgh Opera, and others throughout the United States, Canada,
Europe, and South America; moreover, she has been accompanied by
such celebrated orchestras as the New York Philharmonic and the
symphonies of London, Boston, Cleveland, and Detroit; and

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5 WHEREAS, In 1984, Ms. Conrad returned to her alma mater to 6 lend her voice for the premiere of *Al-Inkishafi*, and the following 7 year, she was named a Distinguished Alumnus by the Ex-Students' 8 Association of The University of Texas; she has also been honored 9 with invitations to sing at the White House for Lady Bird Johnson's 10 75th birthday and to perform for Pope John Paul II during his visit 11 to New York City in 1995; and

12 WHEREAS, Today, among her other pursuits, Ms. Conrad spends time at her vocal studio in Manhattan and works closely with the 13 14 Manhattan School of Music as the cofounder and codirector of its 15 Wagner Theater Program; she also regularly participates in the Distinguished Alumnus Awards at UT, where she often sings "The Eyes 16 17 of Texas"; fittingly, the university has created an endowed presidential scholarship in fine arts in Ms. Conrad's name, and in 18 19 2005, the Dolph Briscoe Center for American History at UT announced the Endowment for the Study of the American Spiritual, for which Ms. 20 21 Conrad serves as the national ambassador; she released a recording of spirituals in 1995 with the choir of the Convent Avenue Baptist 22 23 Church and remains dedicated to preserving this art form; and

24 WHEREAS, With talent and perseverance, Barbara Smith Conrad 25 has become a world-renowned mezzo-soprano, and in realizing her 26 dreams, she is an inspiration to countless individuals; now, 27 therefore, be it

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1 RESOLVED, That the 81st Legislature of the State of Texas 2 hereby commend Barbara Smith Conrad on her accomplished musical 3 career and her role in the movement toward civil rights in the 4 United States of America, and extend to her sincere best wishes for 5 continued success and happiness; and, be it further

6 RESOLVED, That an official copy of this resolution be 7 prepared for Ms. Conrad as an expression of high regard by the Texas 8 House of Representatives and Senate.
