HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Public-spirited citizens of Matagorda County are
- 2 gathering in Austin on March 10, 2009, to celebrate Matagorda
- 3 County Day at the State Capitol; and
- WHEREAS, This region of prairie, salt marshes, and coastal
- 5 waterways has long been home to abundant wildlife, including
- 6 bobcats, coyotes, deer, and waterfowl; the name Matagorda, a
- 7 Spanish phrase meaning "thick brush," derived from the dense
- 8 canebrakes that once grew along the shore; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Karankawa Indians were living in the area when the
- 10 first European explorers passed through in the 1500s, and they were
- 11 still there, though fewer in number, in 1822 when Stephen F. Austin
- 12 founded a colony at the mouth of the Colorado River; the town of
- 13 Matagorda was established in 1829 as a military post, and two years
- 14 later a customs house was opened in the community; and
- WHEREAS, Matagorda County was among the original 23 counties
- 16 created by the Republic of Texas in 1836; for a number of years, the
- 17 town of Matagorda ranked as the second-largest seaport in Texas,
- 18 and the first several decades of the county's history witnessed the
- 19 development of significant cotton, sugar, and cattle industries;
- 20 after the boll weevil became a threat to the cotton crop at the turn
- 21 of the 20th century, more and more farmers began to grow rice; the
- 22 discovery of oil and sulfur in the early 1900s led to further
- 23 diversification of the area's economy; and
- WHEREAS, Today, farming, ranching, and petroleum continue to

- 1 be the economic mainstays of Matagorda County; the area is also the
- 2 site of the South Texas Project Electric Generating Station, one of
- 3 the largest nuclear power plants in the nation, which supplies
- 4 electricity to more than one million homes and businesses in South
- 5 Central Texas; other enterprises and industries include shipyards,
- 6 commercial fishing, and tourism; and
- WHEREAS, Bay City, the county seat, hosts the county fair,
- 8 livestock show, and rodeo in early spring and the Rice Festival in
- 9 the fall, while attractions in Palacios include the reenactment of
- 10 La Salle's landing on the Fourth of July and the Texas Seafood
- 11 Festival in October; yearly highlights in Sargent include the July
- 12 Jamboree and, in November, the Lighted Boat Parade; and
- WHEREAS, Residents and visitors alike enjoy the county's fine
- 14 beaches and the opportunities for fishing along Matagorda Bay; in
- 15 addition, the area is renowned among birders across the nation as a
- 16 premier destination, with the annual Mad Island Christmas Bird
- 17 Count consistently placing in the top five national counts; the
- 18 fascinating story of the final expedition of the French explorer La
- 19 Salle is featured at museums in Bay City and Palacios, where
- 20 artifacts from his ship, La Belle, are displayed; a half-scale
- 21 replica of the ship is docked in Palacios; and
- WHEREAS, Matagorda County is blessed with a rich history and
- 23 abundant natural resources, and its residents may take great pride
- 24 in their legacy and bright future; now, therefore, be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the 81st Legislature of the State of Texas
- 26 hereby declare March 10, 2009, as Matagorda County Day at the State
- 27 Capitol and extend to the visiting delegation sincere best wishes
