CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Family and friends are mourning the loss of Mary
2 Ammons Fisher of Paris, Texas, who died on March 9, 2009, at the age
3 of 89; and

4 WHEREAS, Mary Ammons was born in Paris on November 16, 1919,
5 to Jess and Augusta "Gussie" Burger Ammons; after graduating from
6 Paris High School, she attended Paris Junior College; she worked at
7 Camp Maxey during World War II and went on to work at the Veterans
8 Administration; in 1948, she was joined in matrimony to George
9 Oscar Fisher, Jr., and they enjoyed a long life together until his
10 death in 2006; and

11 WHEREAS, Mrs. Fisher worked for the Texas Employment
12 Commission and later moved on to the local office of the Social
13 Security Administration, where she retired after 15 years of
14 service in 1975; she was an active member of Calvary United
15 Methodist Church; and

17 be fondly remembered by those whose lives were touched by her
18 affection and friendship; now, therefore, be it
