## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, In 2001, the 77th Texas Legislature passed House
- 2 Concurrent Resolution 38, which approved the construction of a
- 3 statue or monument on the Capitol grounds that pays tribute to the
- 4 contributions of Tejanos to the State of Texas; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Eight years later, the statue is awaiting
- 6 installation on the Capitol grounds, but 13 T.A.C. Section 111.25
- 7 contains a prohibition on placing additional memorials and/or
- 8 monuments on the Capitol grounds, with an exception provided for
- 9 the placement of the Emancipation Juneteenth monument; as long as
- 10 this rule stands, the vast contributions of Tejanos to the State of
- 11 Texas continue to go unrecognized on the Capitol grounds; and
- 12 WHEREAS, These public lawns display monuments to people,
- 13 ideals, and events integral to the story of Texas, and these
- 14 memorials serve to inform and inspire residents and visitors alike;
- 15 a statue in honor of Tejanos installed on the Capitol grounds would
- 16 permanently acknowledge the role of this important community in
- 17 helping to shape the Lone Star State; now, therefore, be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the 81st Legislature of the State of Texas
- 19 hereby direct the State Preservation Board to amend its rules to
- 20 allow the statue in honor of Tejanos to be placed on the south lawn
- 21 of the Capitol; and, be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the secretary of state forward an official
- 23 copy of this resolution to the executive director and members of the
- 24 State Preservation Board.
