Komen for the Cure, the world's largest 12 grassroots network of breast cancer survivors and activists; and

WHEREAS, Mrs. George has generously used her business acumen to promote the organization's aims as a board member, past president, and co-chair of the record-setting 2008 race; also active as a supporter of Texas Tech University and her community, she serves as a board member for the Texas Tech Graduate Development Council, the Parenting Cottage, and the Lubbock Arts Alliance; and

WHEREAS, With her receipt of a Women of Excellence Award, Stacie George joins an elite group of women who have been honored by the YWCA of Lubbock; distinguished by her intelligence, determination, and talent, she is indeed a worthy role model for this and future generations; now, therefore, be it
