HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 WHEREAS, Many Americans served courageously in the Vietnam
- 2 War, the longest conflict in which the United States has ever been
- 3 engaged; and
- WHEREAS, Members of the U.S. armed forces were initially sent
- 5 to South Vietnam in an advisory capacity in 1961; the first American
- 6 ground combat units arrived there in 1965, and by 1969
- 7 approximately 543,000 U.S. troops were serving in that country; by
- 8 the time the war ended in April 1975, more than three million
- 9 Americans had seen duty in Southeast Asia; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Vietnam War claimed the lives of more than
- 11 58,000 members of the U.S. armed forces, including over 3,400
- 12 Texans; more than 2,500 American servicemen were taken prisoner,
- 13 and an estimated 3,000 to 6,000 were counted as missing in action;
- 14 and
- WHEREAS, Americans owe a lasting debt of gratitude and
- 16 remembrance to the men and women who served this country in Vietnam,
- 17 and it is indeed fitting that a special day be set aside to honor
- 18 those military personnel for their brave and steadfast efforts and
- 19 immeasurable sacrifice in one of the most difficult wars in this
- 20 nation's history; now, therefore, be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the 81st Legislature of the State of Texas
- 22 hereby designate March 29, 2010, as Vietnam Veterans Day in the
- 23 State of Texas and encourage all citizens of the Lone Star State to
- 24 join in observing this solemn day of tribute and commemoration.
