WHEREAS, Many Americans served courageously in the Vietnam War, the longest conflict in which the United States has ever been engaged; and

WHEREAS, Members of the U.S. armed forces were initially sent to South Vietnam in an advisory capacity in 1961; the first American ground combat units arrived there in 1965, and by 1969 approximately 543,000 U.S. troops were serving in that country; by the time the war ended in April 1975, more than three million Americans had seen duty in Southeast Asia; and

WHEREAS, The Vietnam War claimed the lives of more than
58,000 members of the U.S. armed forces, including over 3,400
Texans; more than 2,500 American servicemen were taken prisoner,
