H.J.R. No. 27

A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 proposing a constitutional amendment to establish English as the  
2 official language of Texas and require that official acts of  
3 government be taken in English.

4 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares:

6 (1) the people of the United States have brought to  
7 this nation the cultural heritage of many nations;

8 (2) the people of the United States, despite their  
9 many differences, have lived together harmoniously and  
10 productively as citizens of one nation;

11 (3) the traditional and common language of the United  
12 States and of this state is English;

13 (4) a knowledge of the common language is essential to  
14 full exercise of constitutional freedoms, informed and  
15 knowledgeable empowerment as voters, citizen checks against  
16 government abuses, individual prosperity, and independence;

17 (5) the English language has been our strongest bond  
18 to one another as fellow citizens and has contributed substantially  
19 to national unity and societal cohesiveness;

20 (6) English has been this nation's language by custom  
21 only and warrants special legal protection;

22 (7) government has a fiduciary responsibility to the  
23 citizenry to ensure that it operates as efficiently as possible,  
24 and the growth of multiple language bureaucracies and printing

1 represents an abrogation of this fiduciary responsibility; and

2 (8) this state, its political subdivisions, and the  
3 federal government have a responsibility to ensure that citizens  
4 have opportunities to learn English.

5 SECTION 2. Article XVI, Texas Constitution, is amended by  
6 adding Section 73 to read as follows:

7 Sec. 73. (a) In this section, "official act of government"  
8 means:

9 (1) an action of this state or a political subdivision  
10 of this state that carries the full weight and authority of law; or

11 (2) an official document recorded or maintained by  
12 this state or a political subdivision of this state for the public  
13 domain, including a tax record, professional license, deed, real  
14 estate record, publicly probated will or other document of a court  
15 system, or a public proceeding of a governing body of this state or  
16 a political subdivision of this state.

17 (b) It is the purpose of this section to preserve, protect,  
18 and strengthen the unifying role of English as the official  
19 language of this state.

20 (c) English is the official language of this state and is  
21 the language of official acts of government.

22 (d) This state or a political subdivision of this state may  
23 not make any policy expressing a preference for any language other  
24 than English or diminishing or ignoring the unifying role of  
25 English as designated by this section, except as provided by  
26 Subsection (f).

27 (e) An elected or appointed officer of this state or a

1 political subdivision of this state shall take all reasonable steps  
2 to ensure that the role of English as the official language of this  
3 state is preserved and enhanced.

4 (f) This section does not:

5 (1) supersede contrary provisions imposed under  
6 federal law;

7 (2) prohibit the use of another language for the  
8 public safety, health, or justice;

9 (3) prohibit instruction in foreign language courses;

10 (4) prohibit instruction designed to aid students with  
11 limited English proficiency in their transition and integration  
12 into the education system; or

13 (5) prohibit the promotion of international commerce  
14 or tourism.

15 (g) The Legislature or a governing body of a political  
16 subdivision of this state may not appropriate any money to promote  
17 the use of or demonstrate a preference for any language other than  
18 the official language, except as provided by Subsection (f).

19 (h) This section may not be:

20 (1) construed in any way to infringe on the rights of  
21 citizens, who have every right to choose their own primary  
22 language, in the use of language for private conduct; or

23 (2) used to dictate language policies for the  
24 operation and administration of organizations or businesses in the  
25 unregulated private sector.

26 SECTION 3. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be  
27 submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 3, 2009.

1 The ballot shall be printed to permit voting for or against the  
2 proposition: "The constitutional amendment to establish English as  
3 the official language of Texas and to require that official acts of  
4 government be taken in English."
