A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing a constitutional amendment to protect the right of the
 public to access and use public beaches.

3 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Article I, Texas Constitution, is amended by 5 adding Section 33 to read as follows:

6 Sec. 33. (a) In this section, "public beach" means a state-owned beach bordering on the seaward shore of the Gulf of 7 Mexico, extending from mean low tide to the landward boundary of 8 9 state-owned submerged land, and any larger area extending from the line of mean low tide to the line of vegetation bordering on the 10 Gulf of Mexico to which the public has acquired a right of use or 11 easement to or over the area by prescription or dedication or has 12 established and retained a right by virtue of continuous right in 13 14 the public under Texas common law.

15 (b) The public, individually and collectively, has an 16 unrestricted right to use and a right of ingress to and egress from 17 a public beach. The right granted by this subsection is dedicated 18 as a permanent easement in favor of the public.

(c) The legislature may enact laws to protect the right of
 the public to access and use a public beach and to protect the
 public beach easement from interference and encroachments.

22 (d) This section does not create a private right of 23 <u>enforcement.</u>

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SECTION 2. This proposed constitutional amendment shall be

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submitted to the voters at an election to be held November 3, 2009.
The ballot shall be printed to provide for voting for or against the proposition: "The constitutional amendment to protect the right of the public, individually and collectively, to access and use the public beaches bordering the seaward shore of the Gulf of Mexico."
