WHEREAS, The son of Rosemary Drennan and George Price 4 5 Moncrief, Lee Moncrief was born on July 12, 1951, in Colorado City, 6 Texas; he spent much of his childhood in the southern part of the state, but his father's work as a petroleum engineer also took the 7 family to Tyler and to McComb, Mississippi, during Lee's youth; he 8 graduated from McAllen High School in 1969 and then studied at Texas 9 A&M University before earning a degree in business from The 10 11 University of Texas at Austin in 1974; and

WHEREAS, Moving to Houston in the mid-1970s, he embarked on a successful career in the energy industry that spanned 33 years; specializing in the areas of finance, investment banking, and asset management, he ultimately helped found Moncrief Willingham Energy Advisors in 1999; in addition, he served as the investment manager of HedgeEnergy and was a member of the Independent Petroleum Association of America for 20 years; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Moncrief was joined in matrimony to Nancy Eversole in 1976, beginning their 32 years together; Mr. Moncrief was deeply devoted to his family, which came to include four sons, Lee, Logan, Matthew, and Andrew, and he took great delight in the many activities they shared together; and

Moncrief was an avid sailor who held a 100-ton captain's license and piloted his boat, *Regency*, to a variety of destinations, including ports of call in New England, Florida, and the Caribbean; his interest in nautical endeavors was recognized with his commission as an admiral in the Texas Navy; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Moncrief further indulged his enjoyment of the 7 outdoors through his hobbies of fishing, rafting, camping, hiking, 8 and golf; he also relished the opportunities he had to travel 9 throughout the United States and to visit foreign countries; and

WHEREAS, This respected and influential Texan was active in a 10 variety of organizations; a strong supporter of the Boy Scouts of 11 America, he served as scoutmaster and committee chair of Troop 55 12 and as a member of the board of directors of the Sam Houston Area 13 14 Council; his involvement with The University of Texas included 15 membership in the Hermes Society of the McCombs School of Business, the Longfellow Society, the UT Golf Club, Texas Exes, and the 16 17 executive committee of the Chancellor's Council; moreover, he belonged to the Roaring Fork Club, the Lakewood Yacht Club, and the 18 19 Houston City Club; and

20 WHEREAS, Although his time on this earth ended far too soon, 21 Lee Moncrief lived a caring and purposeful life that balanced 22 professional success with an abiding commitment to his loved ones, 23 and his achievements will long be treasured by those who had the 24 good fortune to know him; now, therefore, be it
