1 WHEREAS, The Texas House of Representatives is pleased to 2 recognize February 3 and 4, 2009, as Palestine Days at the State 3 Capitol; and

WHEREAS, The seat of Anderson County, Palestine was founded in March of 1846, a few months after Texas was admitted to the United States in December of 1845; and

7 WHEREAS, Palestine was largely an agrarian community until 8 1872, when the International and Great Northern Railroad was 9 founded and established its headquarters in the city; Palestine 10 then grew rapidly throughout the 19th and early 20th centuries; and

11 WHEREAS, A mecca of historic resources, Palestine has more 12 than 1,800 historic houses and buildings, most of which are located 13 in the four National Register Historic Districts and three local 14 Palestine Historic Districts; and

WHEREAS, Noted for its exceptional success in preserving its historical integrity, Palestine is a Texas Main Street City, a National Main Street City, and a Preserve America City; and

WHEREAS, The Texas Historical Commission, the City of Palestine, the Palestine Economic Development Corporation, and the citizens, businesses, and civic organizations of Palestine deserve recognition for preserving the city's rich past and for retaining the charm the city offers residents and visitors today; now, therefore, be it
